Rare Bird Sightings Molokai




Two adult and three juvenile federally protected Greater White-fronted Goose (*Anser a. frontalis* or *albifrons*) have been reported at the Kaunakakai Stream, Ranch Camp Monsanto corn field, and the Kaunakakai Wastewater Reclamation Facility. First observed on October 6, the five geese are most-likely a family that strayed off-course on their southerly winter migration. Over the past week, the five geese have been mistaken for another federally protected species, the endangered Nene (Hawaiian Goose, *Branta sandvicensis*), but are much rarer in Hawaii than the Nene. There are fifteen accounts of this species on Molokai from 1895 to 2009. The Greater White-fronted Goose is easily distinguishable by its orange legs and when in flight by a highly visible black 'bar' sweeping across the tail.

The Greater White-fronted Goose breeds in arctic tundra regions of North America and northern Eurasia, and winters in central California and temperate zones along Mexico's eastern coast to the Mississippi River. Non-stop flights are typically made during the migration, reaching speeds of 55 miles per hour. The species is an herbivore, feeding primarily on grasses, seeds, and grain. Vocalizations are similar to those of other geese such as the Nene, making a low 'mur-mur' when feeding and a loud 'honk' when alarmed. When in flight a vibrational whirring sound can be heard from a distance, caused by air passing through the wing and body feathers.

It's Wedgie Season! Recover 'downed' birds for rehabilitation.

October and November is fledging season for wedge-tailed shearwaters. "Wedgies," as they are affectionately called by wildlife biologists, are part of a mixed flock of seabirds that commercial fishermen rely upon to locate schools of ahi and other marketable fish. Young birds fledge from burrows excavated into coastal cliffs to life at sea.



The uau kani, or wedge-tailed shearwater (*Puffinus pacificus*), is 17" in length from bill to tip of tail, with a wingspan of 38". Adult birds leave coastal colonies at dawn to feed on fish and return after dark. Behavior while in these colonies is generally nocturnal and throughout the night birds emit weird moans, groans, and loud screams, thus they are nicknamed the "moaning bird."

Wedge-tailed shearwaters nest on all the major and offshore islands in the Hawaiian chain by digging a burrow with their bill and feet or utilizing natural crevices: nesting sites are reused from year to year. The largest colony on Molokai lies hidden in the dunes of The Nature Conservancy's Moomomi Preserve. Discovered September 1999, by Arleone Dibben-Young and U.S. Fish and Wildlife's Calvin Willis while teaching students about Hawaii's coastal plants, the colony is now actively managed by Nature Conservancy staff resulting with more than 400 young birds fledged per season. Egg laying begins mid-June, with one bright white egg forming the clutch. Parents share the 53-day incubation period, usually in stints of 7 to 10 days, and sometimes sit side-by-side. Chicks are fed fish once a day by regurgitation. Parents leave the nest site 2-3 weeks before their young have fledged (which takes approximately 100-115 days). Shearwaters are clumsy on land... legs are placed so far to the rear of the body that they cannot walk, so instead waddle. Young birds not yet capable of flight may wander from their burrows in search of food. At this time they are highly vulnerable to predators and often fall prey to mongoose, cats and dogs. Some young birds starve to death while waiting for their feathers to grow to flight length. Many fledglings are attracted at night by urban lights and fall into residential areas or onto highways where they are struck by automobiles.

Statewide community efforts assist in the recovery and release of several hundred juvenile seabirds annually. Chicks that have wandered too far from the nest and are not yet capable of flight must be briefly held in captivity by State and Federal permitted wildlife rehabilitators. When ready for release, birds are fitted with a U.S. Geological Survey metal bird band. If you find a 'downed' seabird, call Arleone at 553-5992.

The goal of the founders of America was to restrict government within severe limits and to protect the rights of sovereign individuals. Government has NO rights!



"A well regulated militia, being necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed." Exercise the 2nd Amendment.

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


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

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Special ed parents to rally on furloughs

Special ed parents are planning a rally/meeting tomorrow Thursday evening at the State Capitol to protest Furlough Fridays. For special ed students, eliminating those Fridays will violate many of the agreed IEPs (Individual Education Plans) which bind the school to provide certain instruction and services. That's against federal law. And that means that special ed parents may have powers to stop it.

For any student in Hawaii, cutting class hours further is bad news.

One parent has calculated that at her student's school there will be only eight (8) full days of instruction in the month of December, plus three (3) partial days (days when the kids will be sent home at 1 p.m.). Actually... October is not much better. According to the same parent's calculations, her school will have only eight full days of instruction this month and five early release days. November is slightly better: Thirteen instruction days plus five early release days.

We owe our children better than that.

Why look at special ed in particular? There is the federal law that protects their programs, the IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act). Regular ed students may not have a way to challenge the furloughs, but special needs parents might have that power.

Obama flips, opposes media shield law

The New York Times reports today White House officials told congressional leaders they opposed the legislation pending in the Senate Judiciary Committee that would shield reporters from jail time for failing to reveal sources. The Times cites "several people involved with the negotiations." [Editor & Publisher, White House Wants Fewer Protections in Shield Law, 10/1/2009]

Sheesh. Obama was indeed born in Hawaii, but he left. If he hadn't, I suggest we'd have to kick him out.

Hawaii has a shiny new shield law, by the way, that was recently tested. The proposed federal law that our prez wants to gut would apply to federal cases.

More on media shield from news sources:

Barack Obama's administration White House officials told congressional leaders they opposed the legislation pending in the Senate Judiciary Committee that would shield reporters from jail time for failing to reveal sources. Obama sent to Congress "sweeping revisions" to the bill that "would significantly weaken its protections against forcing reporters to testify."

The current form has provisions requiring prosecutors to "exhaust other methods for finding the source of the information before subpoenaing a reporter, and would balance investigators' interests with 'the public interest in gathering news and maintaining the free flow of information.'"

But under the administration's proposal, those procedures would not apply to leaks of a matter deemed to cause "significant" harm to national security, the Times reported. Moreover, judges would be instructed to be deferential to executive branch assertions about whether a leak caused or was likely to cause such harm, according to officials familiar with the proposal.

The two Democratic senators who have been prime sponsors of the legislation, Charles E. Schumer of New York and Arlen Specter of Pennsylvania, said on Wednesday that they were disappointed by the administration's position.

Mr. Specter called the proposed changes "totally unacceptable," saying they would gut meaningful judicial review. In a recent letter calling for a vote on the shield bill, Mr. Specter said that at least 19 journalists had been subpoenaed by federal prosecutors for information about confidential sources since 2001 and that four had been imprisoned for refusing to comply.

Among them was Judith Miller, who as a reporter for The New York Times was subpoenaed in connection to the Valerie Wilson C.I.A. leak case. Prosecutors also threatened two San Francisco Chronicle reporters with jail over reporting based on leaked grand jury information about steroid use by professional athletes.

And in a statement, Mr. Schumer said: "The White House's opposition to the fundamental essence of this bill is an unexpected and significant setback. It will make it hard to pass this legislation."

But Ben LaBolt, White House spokesman, "The president believes the courts should have the power to review whether administrations appropriately conclude that the disclosure of information is necessary because maintaining confidentiality could cause significant harm to our national security," Mr. LaBolt said.

The administration informed Congress of its proposal after an Oval Office meeting Monday between Mr. Obama and several top members of his national security team, including Attorney General Eric H. Holder Jr.; the F.B.I. director, Robert S. Mueller III; and Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano, according to people involved with the negotiations. Military and intelligence officials have also expressed concerns about the bill.

Several advocates for reporters' groups reacted with dismay. They noted that as a senator, Mr. Obama had co-sponsored an earlier version of the "media shield" bill and that Mr. Holder had testified in favor of such legislation.

Proponents of a shield law argue that it is in the public interest to allow reporters to protect confidential sources in order to bring important information to light. Opponents note that the unauthorized disclosure of classified information is illegal and argue that members of the news media should not be allowed to decide whether exposing national security secrets is justified.

About three dozen states have some form of a reporter-shield law, Ms. Dalglish said. [Hawaii now has a sort of reporters shield law].

The House has already approved a version of the shield bill, but it has stalled in the Senate Judiciary Committee. Just pass it out, and send it to the President.

"If the president wants to veto it, let him veto it," Mr. Specter said. "I think it is different for the president to veto a bill than simply to pass the word from his subordinates to my subordinates that he doesn't like the bill."

Or, maybe Obama can have reporters sent to RENDITION torture in foreign countries to make them divulge their sources of leaks on corruption ??
