Aina Lost

I have been complaining about the erosion of the lands of this roadside beach for past 34 years, and now this dead coconut tree, which was alive on the edge of grass just ten years ago, is left standing alone as a witness and a measure of the land lost to erosion at this popular beach park five east of Kaunakakai. There is not much left of the grassy park aina, maybe 60 feet at most, where there used to be about 100 feet wide grass to the shoreline high water mark.

We need a seawall and backfilling restoration, immediately. If the County and State would get out of the way, I am sure our local construction crews would restore the aina with solid backfill and a seawall to protect from future erosion, so the People now and future will have the benefit of this great seaside park.

I will confer with our Shoreline Planner, Thorne Abbott and State DLNR, Office of Conservation and Coastal Lands, regarding the situation at the beach park as well as at Waialua, and get back to you as soon as I know more. Perhaps you can give me a tour of all the high erosion areas you know of along the south coast of Molokai, so I can get a better understanding of the problem. Also, Councilmember Danny Mateo is our Molokai representative, and he should be advised of the problem as well, as he may be able to help us find funding for repairs, possible beach renourishment.

DLNR Stream Flow Standards Needed for Molokai, too!

-- PUBLIC MEETING ON October 28 SCHEDULED --

The State Water Commission will hold another public information meeting on Maui, to give an update on its implementation of instream flow standards for six east Maui streams. The meeting is on October 28 at 7 p.m. at Ke'anae Elementary School. For more information call 587-0214.

This meeting will focus on the implementation of the interim instream flow standards for Palauhulu, Waiokamilo, and Wailuanui Streams.

The Commission has been working with the U.S. Geological Survey, the DLNR Division of Aquatic Resources and East Maui Irrigation Co. to develop a timeline that will restore flow to these east Maui streams in the coming weeks.

"Our first priority is to ensure that stream flow is restored in a timely manner, and that those flows comply with the standards set by the Commission," said Ken Kawahara, Water Commission Deputy Director.

"Since this is the first time that such standards have been set, the Commission wants to ensure that the process is well documented and monitored. We have an obligation to see that the water requirements of the environment and community are met. At the same time, we have an incredible opportunity to study the results of stream flow restoration in east Maui," he said.

The Commission is currently developing a plan that involves collecting baseline stream information before water is released, documenting flow restoration efforts, monitoring the stream after restoration, and then establishing a monitoring program over the long-term.



BOE's Watanabe Sets Record Straight Governor Directs BOE to Cut Budget by \$68 million

There is a vicious rumor circulating that the Board of Education is the source of major budget cuts recently reported by the media. Let's set the record straight.

The economy of our State is not generating sufficient tax revenues to fund government operations at current budget levels. In response to the governor's instructions that all State departments submit major budget cuts, the BOE submitted a budget reduction amount of \$46 million dollars for the fiscal biennium of 2009-2011. A reduction of 15% of discretionary funds.

In addition, for this year, 2008-2009, the BOE earlier this summer approved mandatory DOE cuts of nearly \$20 million dollars.

I have said consistently that I will fight to keep education dollars flowing for school level operations. We must not reduce the funding at schools where teaching and student learning takes place. As painful as it was, the BOE proposed cuts of \$46 million dollars came from State and District DOE budgets. Affected are 244 staff positions, travel and supplies, equipment acquisition and system technology upgrades. Training programs for teachers and school administrators have been greatly reduced. This will affect our ability to meet BOE goals for adequate staffing of schools with highly trained administrators and teachers. There are many other worthy programs that have been reduced or cut out entirely, but none at the school level thus far.

The Governor has said that \$46 million dollars is not enough. I guess this means we disagree.

I will continue to make responsible decisions as your elected representative on the State Board of Education and pledge to continue the fight to keep the dollars flowing to our schools.

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Hawaii Man Fears MPD

John Tyler - letter to 2nd District Court

In light of your obvious corrupt court hearings that you repeatedly schedule for me instead of setting up a trial date for the false arrest and attempt on my life on January 8, 2008 this case is being remanded to the People's court on www.hawaiian-tv.com where We the People will accept all testimony and evidence collected for the people to scrutinize and decide the verdict. You are encouraged to post and present all testimony and present all evidence collected in your mock trial where you have so far denied and ignored my motions, exhibits and documents and refuse my legal right to extended media coverage by ignoring my 6 applications sent or hand delivered to your corrupt court. This constitutes another Court hearing for Obstruction of Court which has to be addressed in the federal United States District Court on Oahu before proceeding with prosecution.

You can take all the exhibits and motions that you have totally ignored that I hand delivered to your court on September 21, 2008 as an ex parte appearance for my scheduled appearance on October 22, 2008. Along with your \$1,400.00 extortion bail and all the airfare and expenses I have had to endure I no longer have enough money to fly back to Maui at \$120.00 each way to make it it to your next mock hearing. I was told by one of your public pretenders that I have to take a public defender which any one familiar with law knows is not true.

You made my case the last case on the docket even alphabetically my name was not last so you could again have my Sept 25 hearing in a 'Star Chamber' (you're a 'star' in their court, no one else but you, no witnesses) court to cover up the corrupt way you hold court.

Although required by law after stating for the record I was again silenced in your kangaroo court. You obviously have something to hide when you continuously ignore my requests for extended media coverage and continually refuse to give me change of venue to the Big Island and refuse my motion for discovery to identify Maui Community Correctional facility guards who threatened my life and assaulted me and broke my ankle with leg irons when I was sent to the front office upon release. The Guard with tattoos all over his arms from the dorm told me upon being released "We know what you look like and will see you on the outside." He also informed me that police officers including Garrett Benito would be looking for me. I am not safe being forced to return to Maui.

There are numerous incidents of false imprisonment in the Hawaii court system and the mafia police and courts cover it up and murder those who want to take legal action.

I have sent in a request for extended media coverage 5 times to the 2nd district court and they have ignored all my requests. I have a legal right to media coverage being owner of the only public access tv station in Hawaii. They won't accept my web based media outlet because it isn't on their approved cover up news agencies. They have also denied my request for change of venue and motions for discovery to identify the prison guards who assaulted me, broke my ankle with tight leg irons and made threats on my life.

They want to privatize my court hearings so they can railroad me back to the Maui Jail where they plan to have me murdered! They created a whole new court case for criminal contempt of court by holding a secret hearing for trespassing that I was never notified of after I was bailed out on \$1,200 for the trumped up disorderly conduct charge. This resulted in another \$200 bail I had to pay and another court hearing for criminal contempt which for no reason have denied my motion for change of venue to the Big Island so I don't have to go back to Maui where my life has been threatened by police and prison guards. They don't want media coverage to keep secret their illegal proceeding.

Maui Police Kick a man while he is surrendered on the ground with gun to his head

On the morning of October 21, 2008 several people witnessed the Maui Police repeatedly kick a man while he was surrendered not resisting laying on the ground with a gun to his head in the parking lot of the gutted out building that is to become a prison half way house on Vineyard street in Wailuku. One witness yelled at the cops "Why are you kicking him can't you see that he is not resisting?"

This is just another example of the brutality and even murderers commonly being done by these tyrants who call themselves "Law Enforcement Officers."

Police Power is for The People

The police power stated in the PREAMBLE to the Constitution for the United States of America is the Authority of the People to enforce the law.

WE THE PEOPLE of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

Lawful gun ownership lowers violent crime

I am writing on behalf of Lessons In Firearms Education, a nonprofit service club of NRA-certified basic firearms safety instructors.

The state attorney general's report of a 60 percent increase in gun registrations in Hawaii from 2000 through 2007 should be viewed as a good sign of sovereignty and self government. Unfortunately, one Meda Chesney-Lind, University of Hawaii criminologist, opined that "Any time you increase the number of guns in the community, you increase the likelihood of higher suicide rates and higher homicide rates," but she is wrong. U.H. "experts" has a history of false and misleading politically correct statements, e.g. Chip Fletcher says seawalls cause beach erosion, which is also false, but is adopted by State.

Research on U.S. communities shows that suicide rates remain unchanged and violent crime decreases in communities where lawful gun ownership increases. Data from the Hawaii State Department of Health show Hawaii suicide rates have declined 18 percent from 2000 to 2006 during the same period the AG reports a 60 percent rise in gun registrations; and, Hawaii homicide rates, according to the FBI Uniform Crime report, dropped 45% at the same time.


Molokai High Course Registration for School Year 2009-2010 starts Oct. 30.
