These are juxtaposed against successful prosecutions in which the judges clearly browbeat the juries into accepting at face value what the prosecutors claim. In one frightening case, a Federal Judge rules from the bench that the government is not under any legal obligation to show any laws it claims are being broken during a trial.

Russo then moves into the police state tactics used by the IRS in enforcement actions, detailing how accusation alone (in this case, false) can trigger the complete ruin of the victims' homes and businesses.



It's Wedgie Season!

October and November is fledging season for wedge-tailed shearwaters. "Wedgies," as they are affectionately called by wildlife rehabilitators, are part of a mixed flock of seabirds that commercial fishermen rely upon to locate schools of ahi and other marketable fish. Young birds fledge from burrows excavated into coastal cliffs to life at sea.

The uau kani, or wedge-tailed shearwater (*Puffinus pacificus*), is 17" in length from bill to tip of tail, with a wingspan of 38". Adult birds leave coastal colonies at dawn to feed on fish and return after dark. Behavior while in these colonies is generally nocturnal and throughout the night birds emit weird moans, groans, and loud screams, thus they are nicknamed the "moaning bird."

Wedge-tailed shearwaters nest on all the major and offshore islands in the Hawaiian chain by digging a burrow with their bill and feet or utilizing natural crevices. Wedge-tailed shearwater nesting sites are reused from year to year: birds lie on their sides to kick debris and loose sand backward in little jets, then line the nest with vegetation.

The largest colony on Molokai lies hidden in the dunes of The Nature Conservancy's Moomomi Preserve and is actively managed by staff with nesting surveys and predator control. Egg laying begins mid-June, with one bright white egg forming the clutch. Parents share the 53-day incubation period, usually in stints of 7 to 10 days, and sometimes sitting side-by-side. Chicks are fed fish once a day by regurgitation. Parents leave the nest site 2 - 3 weeks before their young have fledged (which takes approximately 100 to 115 days). Shearwaters are clumsy on land-- legs are placed so far to the rear of the body that they cannot walk, so instead waddle. Young birds not yet capable of flight may wander from their burrows in search of food. At this time they are highly vulnerable to predators and often fall prey to mongoose, cats and dogs. Some young birds starve to death while waiting for their feathers to grow to flight length. Many fledglings are attracted at night by urban lights and fall into residential areas or onto highways where they are struck by automobiles.

Organized community efforts assist in the recovery and release of several hundred juvenile birds annually. Chicks that have wandered too far from the nest and are not yet capable of flight must be briefly held in captivity by State and Federal permitted wildlife rehabilitators. Military Commissions Act Includes a "Get Out of Jail Card" for Bush War Crimes

The MCA law states "no person may invoke the Geneva Conventions or any protocols thereto in any habeas corpus or other civil action or proceeding to which the United States, or a current or former officer, employee, member of the Armed Forces, or other agent of the United States is a party as a source of rights in any court of the United States or its States or territories."

In effect, that provision amounts to a broad amnesty for all U.S. officials, including President Bush and other senior executives who may have authorized torture, murder or other violations of human rights.

In signing the Military Commissions Act of 2006, Bush remarked that "one of the terrorists believed to have planned the 9/11 attacks said he hoped the attacks would be the beginning of the end of America." Bush added, "He didn't get his wish."

Or, perhaps, the suspected terrorist did: Patriot Act; Wars in Afghanistan and Iraq; 27,000 US military dead; Trillion dollar expenses; and Bush's new MCA 2006.

After weeks of humid, vog, variable to zero winds across the state, a sudden thunderstorm dropped rain that triggered two flashfloods from Pukoo to Halawa Thursday, October 18th. Flash flood warnings on the radio reported the “Molokai and Maui County” severe weather as thunder boomed and flash floods swept to the shorelines at Pukoo, Kainalu, Waialua and Honouliwai.



At Kainalu, where a bridge construction project to mitigate previous severe flood conditions, high water at the site became a traffic stop until flood waters subsided. Residents of nearby homes reported a “mess” but no significant damage to structures or injuries. State highway crews cleared rocks and debris late into the night between Honouliwai and Pukoo.

How Much Profit is too much?

Molokai Ranch (MPL) Sales statistics

Sales of MPL properties/ Kaluakoi 2003-2006 \$25,342,900.00 Sales of MPL properties/ Maunaloa 2003-2006 \$9,182,856.00

Profits of BIL (Parent company to MPL) 2004-2005 \$149,500,000.00

Molokai Ranch (MPL) has constantly reminded us that the Sales of La'au Lots are crucial to the funding of Kaluako'i Hotel renovations as well as continuously reminding the Molokai Community of it's annually occurring 3.7 million dollar operating expense loss. What they fail to tell us is that a significant portion of these losses are based on previously poor management and investment strategies including tent camps and the lodge in Maunaloa. Also, what MPL fails to mention are it's excellent investment returns in regard to it's buy out of Kaluako'i Properties from Kukui Molokai, which MPL purchased for 9 million dollars. The increased equity of these lands has netted an equitable profit 10- 20 times what it purchased the land for. In just the last three years alone, Molokai Ranch, under the names of Molokai Acquisitions and Kaluako'i Residential has sold over 25 million dollars of residential lots in the Kaluako'i area, these lots having no additional expense outlay other than property taxes and seller fees. MPL still remains with considerable land holdings in the Kaluako'i area including a number of residential Ag parcels, the existing Hotel, existing golf course and restaurant sights, future Hotel sights, a future golf course sight, as well as acreage just north of the Kaluako'i Hotel which is designated rural and could possibly allow up to 500 additional homes or serve as expansion of the existing hotel. The 150 rooms of the hotel, without renovation, easily value at a low figure of \$200,000 a room. A low end value of 30 million dollars. Molokai Ranch (MPL) also sold over 9 million dollars of property in the Maunaloa area in the last 3 years. On top of this, the parent company has demonstrated a profit over the last two years of approximately 150 million dollars.

With these type of assets it is difficult to understand why MPL can not fund the hotel construction without the sales of La'au point lots.

In 2001 Molokai Ranch purchased the lands previously owned by Alpha USA. for the amount of 6 Million dollars, These are the lands that include the proposed 200 parcel La'au Point project. At today's market rate these lots would sell for 1-2 million dollars a lot. If the donation of 26,000 acres seems like a generous offer, we need to

While it can be said that increased equity benefits the local home buyer as well as the new investor, the fact is that most local homeowners usually do not buy and sell and consequently do not reap the benefits of increased equity. Most of the profits are made by those who come to buy and sell and treat our island as nothing more than stock in the stock market. Ultimately what does increase are property taxes. Also rent prices move up as land values increase. Affordable housing will help but will not be able to fill in the gap.

realize that most of these lands being donated to the trust are not of great value to the ranch and that in turn it is possible for the ranch to sell the lots at La'au for a total of anywhere from 200 to 400 million dollars, and if the market rises, as much as a half billion dollars could be retrieved.

While the concealing of most of this information from the Molokai community is bad enough itself, the entire plan should be of concern as it seems to follow the traditional real estate/ tourism model that has devastated the working class of other islands by driving up equity on real estate and ultimately creating a drastic increase in the local cost of living. This model works to the distinct advantage of outside inves-

tors, and for those in the real estate industry, as well as for those that already have significant financial holdings, but fails the average family. It is expected that most of the jobs created by this plan would fall in the \$10 an hour category. At this income level, if the effect of tourism on real estate drove up property values even 5% annually, the income received, as far as how earned income translates into home buying power, would be close to zero, and at this level of income the ability of buying a home would be impossible without outside help.

In regard to the proposed La'au project, it is sad that the EC, which was intended to serve the community and be the community voice, has been used by Molokai Ranch to accomplish it's purpose. The EC has failed to hear the majority voice of Molokai and in doing so has alienated itself from much of the community. We respectfully ask that the EC truly consider the long term effects of this project and the potential consequences that will effect every aspect of our island lifestyle. Extreme class separation, disregard for our culture and lifestyle, abuse of our natural resources and rising costs will be just a few of the consequences of this project. We need to begin to recognize the real value and uniqueness of our island. We are the last Hawaiian Island! If we are patient and seek what is pono, we will see business models come our way that recognize this uniqueness. Rather than be a second class Maui, we can become the island that encompasses all that is truly Hawaiian. To embrace this will be to the benefit of all!

Disastrous War Coverup in Iraq: Forward Base Falcon Blows Up; hundreds dead.

October 10, 2006, Iraqi Resistance groups lobbed two rockets and three mortar rounds into the immense Forward Base Falcon, the largest American military base in Iraq, located 13 km south of the Green Zone in Baghdad. In addition to accurate mortar fire, Grad and Katyusha rockets were also used to attack the US military base.

Falcon was designed to house a large contingent of American troops, mostly drawn from the 4th Infantry Division, stationed at Ft.Bliss,TX. At the time of the attack, there were approximately 3,000 men inside the camp, which also was filled with - ammunition supplies, fuel, tanks and vehicles.

Iraqi contractors had assisted in the construction of the camp, which occupied nearly a square mile and was surrounded with guard tower-studded high concrete walls, and it is now apparent that the Resistance movement had been given important targets from sources familiar with the layout of the base.

After the initial shelling, fuel and ammunition stores began to erupt with massive explosions that could be heard, and seen, miles away inside the Green Zone where U.S. military and diplomatic units were heavily guarded. The explosions, all of them termed immense by BBC reporters, continued throughout the night. As the huge fires spread throughout the base, punctuated by tremendous explosions, more fuel and ammunition dumps ignited.

In response, US aircraft indiscriminately rocketed and bombed various parts of the city, BBC and AFP correspondents reported.

Intelligence indicates that civilians aligned with a militia organization were responsible for last night's mortar attack, said Lieutenant Colonel Jonathan Withington, spokesman for the U.S. 4th Infantry Division. An after action report, issued by the Department of Defense, stated that: On October 10, 2006, at approximately 10:40 p.m., an 82mm mortar round, fired by militia forces from a residential area in Abu T-Shir, caused a fire at an Ammunition Supply Point (ASP) at FOB Falcon. The ASP, containing tank and artillery rounds, in addition to smaller caliber ammo., set off a series of large explosions. About 100 troops from the 4th Infantry Division were reported to be stationed at the base at the time, but no injuries were reported. "The damage to the area will not degrade the operational capability of MND-B (Multinational Division Baghdad)."

When the flames had been brought under control on the morning of the 11th of October, primarily because the entire camp had been gutted, nine large American military transports with prominent Red Cross markings were observed by members of the foreign media taking off, laded with the dead and the wounded.

Over 300 American troops, including U.S. Army and Marines, CIA agents and U.S. translators were casualties and there also were 165 seriously injured requiring major medical attention and 39 suffering lesser injuries 122 members of the Iraqi armed forces were killed and 90 seriously injured members of same, were also evacuated to the U.S. military

hospital at al-Habbaniyah located some 70km west of Baghdad. Satellite pictures and aerial photographs from neutral sources showed that Camp Falcon suffered major structural damage and almost all the U.S. military's supply of - small arms ammunition,- artillery and - rocket rounds,- tons of fuel, - 6 Apache helicopters, an uncounted but - large number of soft-skinned vehicles such as Humvees and supply trucks were damaged or totally destroyed.

Foreign press observers noted an endless parade of military vehicle recovery units dragging burnt-out heavy tanks and armored personnel carriers to another base outside Baghdad. Many of the walls and towers of the camp were damaged or leveled as were many of the barracks, maintenance depots, and there was considerable damage to the huge mess halls that could hold 3000 soldiers, the huge recreation center with its basketball courts and indoor swimming pools and all the administration buildings. Although official U.S. DoD statements indicated that there were - NO DEATHS; that only a 100 men were inside the base guarding Billions of Dollars of Vital Military Equipment and that there were only 2 minor injuries to personnel, passes belief and certainly reality is more painful than propaganda.

Not only has the U.S. military machine lost much of its armor and transport, and its entire reserves of ammunition and special fuel, but the casualty list for only the first day is over 300.. Here is a transcription of that list who were evacuated to other hospital units.: In re: Insurgent attacks on Forward Base Falcon on 10-11 October, 2006 Official Casualty List from U.S. military hospital at al-Habbaniyah located some 70km west of Baghdad. U.S. medical personnel at al-Habbaniyah initially stated that the US military hospital at the massive American-occupied air base there had begun to receive dead and wounded personnel.

The military hospital in al-Habbaniyah, the largest in occupied Iraq, was opened in response to sharply rising US casualties.

LETTER from soldier: Falcon had also become the largest US weapons arsenal depot in the American General Headquarters in the south of Baghdad and a very tempting target. This time, we heard later, (and officially denied!) the Resistance used Grad and Katyusha rockets instead of mortars and the results were immediate, prolonged and completely devastating. The installation itself is full of smoking rubble, and fires were still burning the following day. Although it is still very early to be accurate, reviews here of Falcon's inventory indicates that losses will certainly exceed \$1 billion. That addresses the loss of property. The loss of life is even worse Over 300 American troops, including U.S. Army and Marines, CIA agents, U.S. translators and contractors were killed or injured outright or died immediately afterwards en route to hospital or in hospital and over 125 seriously injured, requiring major medical attention and 39 suffering lesser injuries. By accounts, charred and totally unrecognizable fragments of personnel were scattered over an eight block area.....Its just too much.
