

Finger Prints for Your Ammo?

Beginning February 1, 2011 you will be required not only show ID but provide a fingerprint to buy ammo for handguns in California. Governor Schwarzenegger signed AB 962 into law on October 11, 2009. And, Hawaii gun owners are the next target for this new violation of 2nd Amendment.

The powers that be keep saying that all these guns laws are about keeping guns out of the hands of criminals. How ridiculous is that considering criminals are criminals BECAUSE they don't follow the rules. This law requires face to face transactions only, (no online purchases), and all purchasers of ammunition to be thumbprinted, IDed, exact types and amounts of ammunition recorded, and carries jail time and fines for selling to known criminals. How stupid is that considering a road trip to a nearby state would only take a few hours, giving the ammo away isn't illegal, and then of course, "representatives" of law enforcement agencies are exempt from this law.

Hawaii /Californians? WAKE UP! REPEAL AB 962

As a resident of the State of California when I am not in Hawaii, I hereby voice my strongest opposition to the passage of Assembly Bill 962 [Restrictions on ammunition sales] by the California Legislature and Governor in 2009.

This action was an attack on common sense and an insult to law-abiding firearms owners throughout the state. Furthermore, AB 962, taking effect on February 1, 2011, mandates individuals purchasing ammunition to be fingerprinted and registered at the time of sale and outlaws mail-order ammunition purchases. AB 962 also requires dealers to maintain these records for at least five years and make them available for inspection by the California

Department of Justice. As an additional burden, ammunition retailers are also required to store ammunition away from purchasers.

This scheme to register firearms owners, as if they were common criminals, must not be allowed to be implemented! Therefore, I respectfully urge the passage of Assembly Bill 373 [Repeal of AB 962].

If passed, AB 373 would return a level of sanity to the issue of obtaining firearms ammunition by law-abiding citizens. Since it is well-known that most criminals don't purchase their firearms and ammunition from lawful sources, AB 373 would allow our already overburdened law enforcement agencies to focus on catching criminals instead of turning them into paperchasing clerks attempting to implement the ill-advised scheme that is AB 962.

I must strongly, urge legislative support for Assembly Bill 373.

Once again a law is passed that only impacts those who are law abiding citizens not the criminals. A criminal can cross the state line to Nevada or Arizona and purchase ammo without restriction. The law abiding citizen becomes part of a data base tracking the purchases of ammo and their buying habits.

The California law also bans the purchase of ammo via mail order or through the internet like we do in Hawaii. Many hobby shooters and firearms safety instructors and those who compete rely on mail order purchases for affordable ammo to be used in target practice.

Makaala! Hawaii is next target !



The goal of the founders of America was to restrict government within severe limits and to protect the rights of sovereign individuals. Government has NO rights!

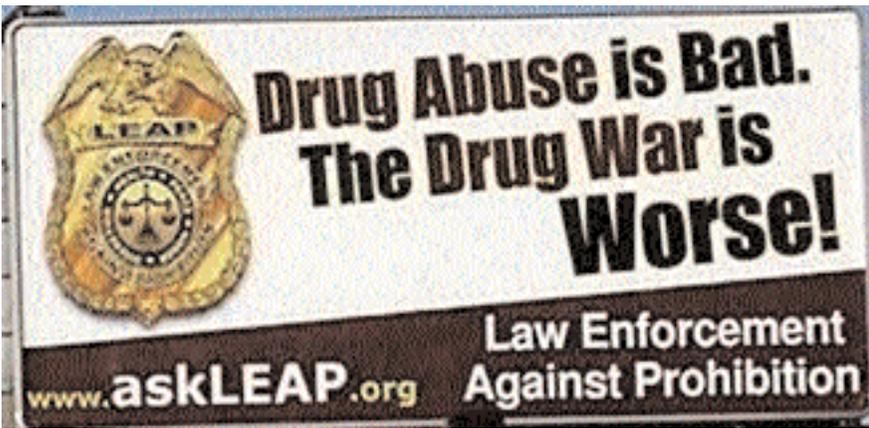

## While Hawaii Legislators Tinker with How to distribute Medical Marijuana 2010.....

### Medical Marijuana News



Washington state House held hearings on a pair of marijuana decriminalization and legalization bills Wednesday, and a statewide poll released Tuesday showed majority support for legalization. Proponents argued that marijuana prohibition has been as ineffective as alcohol Prohibition. "We have not deterred the use of marijuana, nor have we seen a noticeable impact on the availability of marijuana," legalization bill sponsor Rep. Mary Lou Dickerson (D-Seattle) told the committee. "Over the last decade, we have wasted scores of taxpayer dollars on investigation, court proceedings and incarceration."

Under Dickerson's bill, marijuana would be sold in Washington's 160 state-run liquor stores and would be taxed at 15% of the retail price. Funds raised by taxing marijuana would be mainly earmarked for drug abuse prevention and treatment. In November, an initiative now proposed if approved by Voters would remove all state criminal penalties for adults who possess, cultivate, and sell marijuana -- no matter the quantity. Supporters must gather 241,000 valid signatures by July 2 to qualify it for the November ballot.

And, The New York State Assembly's Committee on Health Thursday approved a bill that would legalize the use of marijuana for patients suffering from life-threatening medical conditions. The bill now heads to the Assembly's Public Codes Committee. The bill does not list allowable diseases or conditions.

Instead, it allows practitioners to recommend marijuana for "serious conditions," which it defines as "a severe debilitating or life-threatening condition or a condition associated with or a complication of such a condition, or its treatment." "If a patient and their physician are in agreement that the most effective way of controlling their symptoms is marijuana, government should not stand in the way of treatment," said Gottfried. "It is cruel to turn end-stage patients into criminals when they are following what their doctors recommend for relief."

ALSO, A California bill to legalize the adult use, sale, and production of marijuana for any personal use was approved Tuesday by a 4-3 vote in the California Assembly Public Safety Committee. [Politicians are supporting this bill for the \$50/oz tax that it imposes along with regulations. This is not freedom.]

"AB 390 is a historic reversal of failed marijuana policies," said Gutwillig. "It would begin to control a substance that is already commonly available and consumed, but unregulated. Prohibition has created enormous social costs and jeopardized public safety instead of enhancing it." [ Mexican drug trafficking organizations make billions each year trafficking illegal drugs into the United States, profiting enormously from the prohibitionist drug policies of the US government.]

While the vote was historic -- it marked the first time a state legislative committee anywhere had voted for a marijuana legalization bill -- a Friday legislative deadline means the bill is likely to die before it reaches the Assembly floor.

However, "This historic vote marks the formal beginning of the end of marijuana prohibition in the United States," said Stephen Gutwillig, California state director of the Drug Policy Alliance, who testified before the committee both Tuesday and in an earlier hearing. "Making marijuana legal has now entered the public dialogue in a credible way. Decades of wasteful, punitive, racist marijuana policy have taken quite a toll in this country. The Public Safety Committee has demonstrated that serious people take ending marijuana prohibition seriously."

Orange County Judge Jim Gray, a member of Law Enforcement Against Prohibition, who also testified before the committee last fall. "And if the bill isn't fully enacted into law this year, it will be soon. Or, the bill will be irrelevant because the voters will have passed the measure to regulate and tax marijuana that

will be on the ballot this November," Gray said, and added that the marijuana legalization law would encourage police to focus on serious crimes, violent crimes. The drug wars have failed,...Prohibition has fostered anarchy. Legalization allows regulations, and regulation allows order".

More than a dozen uniformed police chiefs and high-ranking police officers from around the state showed up against the bill, to make their fascist displeasure known. Claude Cook, regional director of the National Narcotics Officers Associations Coalition: "This is dangerous work we do...The drug cartels will thrive. Highway fatalities will rise," he said without explaining how he arrived at those conclusions. "... We are very concerned about marijuana-related violence."

[These recalcitrant police officials apparently are ignorant that it is their Prohibition Laws and policies that have fostered the violent criminal activity related to drugs the past 30 years. Prohibition has benefited only criminals who control drug trades and police who reap in millions of dollars in drug forfeiture money and federal anti-drug grants. Obviously, police and drug dealers do not want Prohibition to end. Law enforcement is an addict, itself. I think the cops see the war on drugs as job security. Billions are spent on nabbing low level dealers and buyers. Those billions go into police paychecks. And Prohibition has fostered corruption within police ranks, too:

### This Week's Corrupt Cops Stories

A sticky-fingering, meth-snorting cop goes away for awhile, and a trio of jail guards get in trouble.

In Glendora, California, a former Glendora police officer was sentenced Tuesday to six months in jail, three years of probation, and a 24-month drug rehabilitation program after pleading no contest to grand theft and methamphetamine possession charges. Timothy Radogna, 34, was arrested in May in an "integrity sting" after superiors received reports he was failing to book drugs and cash into evidence. Police left meth and \$1,000 in cash in a bait car, and Radogna took the bait. He could have gotten up to nine years if he wasn't a cop.

In Beaumont, Texas, a former Texas Department of Corrections guard pleaded guilty Monday to trying to smuggle drugs and a cell phone into the Stiles Unit in his lunchbox. Eric Talmore, 25, copped pleas to bribery and having a prohibited substance in a correctional facility. He got busted with tobacco in his socks, rolling papers in his underwear, and marijuana and a cell phone hidden inside a container of fried rice. He faces up to 30 years in prison when sentenced on February 16, but his attorney is asking for probation.

In Manchester, Kentucky, a Clay County Detention Center guard was arrested Sunday on charges she smuggled drugs to inmates in the jail. Guard Dawn Hayes, 31, fell prey to an undercover investigation by the County Sheriff's Office, taking drugs to be smuggled into the jail from a confidential informant. Hayes is currently residing at her place of employment, behind bars.

In Chesterton, Indiana, an Indiana State Prison guard was arrested January 2 for trying to smuggle tobacco and marijuana into the prison. Barb Roseborough, a nine-year veteran, got caught when prison staff found a package wrapped in electrical tape hidden in the lining of her bag as she reported for work. A second package was later found hidden on her person. She has been charged with trafficking with an offender and felony marijuana possession. She faces from two to eight years on the first count and up to three years on the second. At last report, she was being held at the LaPorte County Jail.

### Police departments are heavily addicted to unconstitutional theft of property, without conviction.

The proceeds from Drug War confiscations have created a law enforcement establishment that cannot survive in its current form without that ill gotten gains. I believe that many cops are relieved that marijuana is soon to be legalized and they will be able to get on with the real job of keeping the peace against boom boxes, illegal fireworks, gang assaults, corrupt politicians, DUI, etc .

**Cops should NOT Testify:** It is completely inappropriate for uniformed police officers to testify at public hearings where policy decisions are being discussed. Uniformed police officers are paid to implement policy in an official capacity, not to take or promote political positions. Were the uniformed police present on paid duty? If so, is it appropriate to be paying our police to function as self-appointed political lobbyists at the taxpayer's expense on official police paid time and over-time? And if they were not on-duty, why were they allowed as private citizens to represent themselves as agents of the state and use the powerful symbolic power of their uniforms to promote a partisan political agenda? Could they not express their opinions as citizens, just as anyone else does at such a public hearing without trying to connivingly cloak their regressive and unenlightened policy position in the mantle of state authority? This strikes me as so shockingly blatant abuse of police authority it angers me me that it continues to pass unchallenged by Hawaii Legislators, and infact it is encouraged. It must be stopped.
