Veteran's Group Speaks Out on War: "I don't think 20,000 more troops is Democratic, I don't think 20,000 troops is Republican. I think it's stupid."

When Iraq war veteran Jon Soltz accused Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-Ky.) of "aiding the enemy," the Democratic senators gathered around him yesterday did not wince. Nor did Democrats object when Soltz, the chairman of a group called VoteVets.org, called President Bush and Vice President Cheney "draft dodgers."

In the United States Congress, where decorum usually holds sway, Soltz and his small band of veterans are saying things many Democrats would like to express but can't. And as the politics heat up over the Iraq war, Democratic leaders increasingly are being drawn to Soltz and his angry soldiers.

VoteVets.org appears to be the most active group trying to influence the debate about the president's plan to send 21,500 more troops to Iraq. Last month, it sent veterans to the home states of Republican senators waffling over resolutions on the war. Next, it ran a stark television ad on Super Bowl Sunday that drew national attention. And this week, group members crisscrossed Capitol Hill, trying to persuade lawmakers and their staffs to oppose the troop increase.

The veterans are selling a blunt message: The Bush strategy in Iraq is a failure, and adding troops sends more young men and women to their deaths. If you care about the military, they told lawmakers, vote against the troop increase. Legislators who are stalling debate on the matter are "cowards," they said.

Soltz, the group's intense 29-year-old co-founder who served in Iraq in 2003, displayed a fiery impatience with the procedural morass that has paralyzed the Senate. "I don't need some fancy Senate talk about why they can't vote," he said in an interview. "We just want a vote. We need a vote that tells the president that his strategy is not working."

Democrats said they will not muzzle the veterans. In many ways, the former soldiers and Marines are expressing sentiments the lawmakers want broadcast, and they help inoculate Democrats against Republican claims that opposing the president's plan undermines the troops.

Sen. John F. Kerry (D-Mass.), said he saw parallels between VoteVets.org and Vietnam Veterans Against the War, the group of protesters he led during Vietnam. He said he recognized the anger he saw in Soltz. "When you come back from fighting the enemy, you are passionate and feel very strongly about duty," Kerry said. "Each one of these folks has earned the right to express their thoughts. Their words ought to stand for themselves. That's exactly how they feel and people ought to listen to them."

In the office of Sen. Blanche Lincoln, the chief of staff and several aides listened with rapt attention Tuesday as Brian Van Riper, a 25-year-old former Marine machine gunner, told how he struggled with creeping doubts during his Iraq tour that peaked when he met a 12-year-old Iraqi girl with a scarred face and missing leg. She was a casualty of the initial air bombing of Baghdad that was supposed to get Saddam, Van Riper said. "That night, I felt a tear down my eye," he said. She is considered just collateral damaged.

VoteVets.org has 20,000 members, including 1,000 veterans of Iraq and Afghanistan, said spokesman Eric Schmeltzer.

Soltz said the group is pro-military and not a front for the Democrats. "I'm a conservative," said Soltz. "I don't think 20,000 more troops is Democratic, I don't think 20,000 troops is Republican. I think it's stupid."

Lt. Watada mistrial clear victory, very likely unqualified

Fort Lewis, WA (Feb. 8, 2007) In a complex and confusing turn of events, Army lead prosecutor Captain Scott Van Sweringen reluctantly requested, and was granted a mistrial in the case of First Lieutenant Ehren K. Watada, the first military officer to publicly refuse to fight in Iraq.

In summation, the day after the prosecution rested a poorly presented case against Lt. Watada for missing movement to Iraq and two counts of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman, the prosecution then requested over the strenuous objections of Lt. Watada's defense team in essence a do over. Lieutenant Colonel Judge John Head then agreed to the do over. The basis for which, and the judges motives, may likely be a matter of debate for some time.

Lt. Watada's civilian lawyer Eric Seitz later explained, The mistrial is very likely to have the consequence of ending this case because a retrial would be a case of double jeopardy based on the military rules for courts martial and applicable case law. Should the Army proceed with a second trial, Seitz said he would seek dismissal of the charges with prejudice so they could not be again filed. I do not expect a retrial to ever occur, stated Seitz. Army Captain Mark Kim, Lt. Watada's appointed military defense lawyer, noted that he agreed with Seitz's conclusions.

John Junker, a University of Washington law professor independently consulted by the Seattle Post-Intelligencer newspaper explained, You can't just stop in the middle and say, I don't like the way it's going and start over. If the defendant objected, it does raise the possibility" of double jeopardy. Junker noted, That doctrine comes from the Constitution.

Molokai - Germany - Serbia

Petra Gabriele's cousin Birget from Germany, wondered over the past years, hearing about Petra's three visits to this far off island in Hawaii. It's 25 hours of travel time from Germany and so different from life there. Birget asked Petra, "Why do you always return to Molokai?" This year, Birget came to see for myself what it is on Molokai.

Since first coming to Molokai four years ago, Petra has learned from Leimana and his ohana about the language and culture that is so different from Germany. She returns home to teach about the aloha spirit and that "Hawaii is more than Waikiki." She is enthusiastic about helping Leimana and Kelii with a new project of a small fishpond for children, next to the massive Kahinapohaku.

Originally from Serbia, Anchorage residents Kala ("like the fish") and daughter Ana are also return visitors to Molokai and like Petra, have learned about the Hawaiian culture, enjoying the warmth and spirit of Mana'e and the Naki Ohana.

Leimana Naki continues as the alaka'i (guide) of the Kahinapohaku, sharing his culture with school students, visitors and residents. He wears a gift of carved Maori fishhook. In return he gave the Maori school, "they don't have a bell to call the students, so I gave them two shells," as he demonstrated by blowing with one he has at the hale. One day he hopes to visit Germany and Serbia, to see the places and different lifestyle and culture the women have exchanged with Leimana.



State of Hawaii must OPPOSE Federal NAIS Program

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is busy implementing the National Animal Identification System (NAIS), a corporate welfare program for Agribusiness and surveillance technology companies. NAIS will drive family farms out of business, raise the price of your food, and increase red tape in nightmarish proportions.
 NAIS will force owners of farm animals, even non-farmers who keep them as pets, to obtain a Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) number for each animal they own. Every time an animal moves beyond the premises it is normally kept, its owner will have to file a report. If a pet goat crosses the street, a report would have to be filed.
 Even though the program is "voluntary" the Agriculture Secretary suggests it will become mandatory if animal owners don't, "volunteer."
 This is very bad for animal lovers and hobbyists, and even worse for farmers trying to make a living. The cost of RFID tags will range from \$3 to \$20 for each animal. There are many other costs and registration fees associated with the program, and potentially heavy fines for incorrect reporting.
 These rules will NOT apply to corporate-owned factory farms! They will need just one Group/Lot ID number to account for scores, even thousands of animals. NAIS will make it easier for Big Agribusinesses to export beef. And it will bring huge profits to corporations that develop surveillance technologies.
 NAIS addresses a "problem" of animal disease control that current laws and agencies already cover. Factory farms are at greater risk of disease outbreaks than are smaller farms, and most contamination occurs at the slaughterhouse or later in the process. To make matters worse, through computer hacking and counterfeit RFID tags, NAIS actually makes our food supply more vulnerable to terrorists and other criminals.

New Book Release: Na Kua'aina: Living Hawaiian Culture Author: Davianna Pomaika'i McGregor



Professor of ethnic studies at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa and a historian of Hawai'i and the Pacific, Davianna Pomaika'i McGregor has collected *mo'olelo* (oral traditions) which reveal how Kua'aina have endured with dignity in rural areas, taking care of *kupuna* (elders); continuing to speak and perpetuate the Hawaiian language and life ways, some toiling in taro patches and sweet potato fields. McGregor looks closely at lifeways on Moloka'i; districts of Hana, Maui and Puna, Hawaii and the *ahupua'a* of Waipi'o, Hawai'i. Kaho'olawe is included as a primary site where the regenerative force of the *kua'aina* from these rural communities have revived cultural practices.

Written by a scholar, NA KUA'AINA - LIVING HAWAIIAN CULTURE is a collection of *mo'olelo* of and by *kupuna* and others who lived before and set the stage of the Hawaiian renaissance beginning in the 1970s. The cover, a portrait of Kaho'olawe revival pioneer, Uncle Harry Mitchell sets the stage for the first chapter and the book.

Photographs of familiar Moloka'i *kupuna*, George Helm, taro farmers and coastline landscapes on Maui and the Big Island are nostalgic, complementing the stories. The rich oral history collections by Mary Kawena Pukui and by the author recount life in Pelekunu (Auntie Harriet Ne) and other Moloka'i cultural *kipuka*.

NA KUA'AINA is rich with information, history and memories for the reader. This is the kind of book you read, re-read, learn and remember more about the people and places of the true Hawai'i. It brings back memories of Auntie Lani, Uncle Walter, Auntie Mary, Auntie Rachael and Auntie Mae. The hours of patient "watch and learn" lauhala from Auntie Louise and the times spent in the garden with Auntie Susie...and those who still patiently share with the community like Cowboy and their haumana.

Na Kua'aina: Living Hawaiian Culture [ISBN 978-0-828-2946-9, University of Hawai'i Press, black & white photos, 372pp.] belongs in every library. -- SP




