## Legislature Considers Bill of Rights Day

Senate Resolution 39, introduced by Senator Sam Slom and House Resolutions HCR 293 and HR 219 introduced by Representative Mele Carroll establishing Hawaii's Bill of Rights Day on December 15 annually at the request of George Peabody is being considered by the Legislature. Citizen's testimony in support is urgently requested.

### RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH BILL OF RIGHTS DAY IN HAWAII

WHEREAS, the first ten amendments to the Constitution of the United States of America, known collectively as the Bill of Rights, were ratified on December 15, 1791;

WHEREAS, the Bill of Rights recognizes, affirms, and protects fundamental human and civil rights for which persons of all races have struggled for years; and

WHEREAS, to preserve the rights and freedoms secured by the Bill of Rights, our Forefathers and hundreds of thousands of men and women serving in the Armed Forces of the United States, as well as the individual non-military patriotic citizens, have sacrificed, suffered, and died; and

WHEREAS, the rights and freedoms guaranteed by the Bill of Rights deserve perennial celebrations to recognize and remember the sacrifices made; and

WHEREAS, freedoms and rights that define America come from the Bill of Rights; WHEREAS, an annual Bill of Rights Day would remind all members of government that government exists to serve, not to rule, the people; and

WHEREAS, in the State of Hawaii, there has been no regular formal observance of a special day commemorating the ratification of the Bill of Rights; and

WHEREAS, to commemorate the Bill of Rights with a special day would honor the fundamental rights it enshrines and the sacrifices made to create and preserve these rights, and would proclaim these rights to the citizens of the whole State of Hawaii, to this Nation, and to the World; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-third Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2005, that a copy of the Bill of Rights be conspicuously posted at the State Capitol and provided to all citizens upon request; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that December 15th of every year be designated Bill of Rights Day in the State of Hawaii; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the first annual commemoration of Bill of Rights Day shall be on December 15, 2005; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all government agencies be encouraged to observe the annual Bill of Rights Day in a manner that brings to mind the meaning and importance of each of the Ten Amendments contained in the Bill; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor of the State of Hawaii, the Speaker of the House, and the President of the Senate.

## KU'E! Government Murder of the Disabled

The story of Florida resident Terri Schiavo[41], who a judge Greer has ordered to be starved to death because she cannot speak or feed herself, should outrage everyone, even farway on Molokai. While our soldiers valiantly fight and die ostensibly so Iraqi's can enjoy human rights, something seriously is wrong at the same time at home an American woman who suffered severe brain damage 15 years ago, possibly due to domestic violence by her husband who has been pursuing the legal route to have her killed, is being subjected to death by dehydration and starvation by order of a judge.

Is this just about a dying woman being allowed to die peacefully? Terri Schiavo expressly wanted to die, claims her husband, Michael. But her mother and her lawyer testify that she wants to live and they are willing to care for her.

Obviously, this isn't about letting someone die peacefully; this is about the government causing someone's death. There is a huge difference. Sixth Commandment [Thou shalt not kill] means it is wrong to murder someone without a just cause, such as self defense. What jurisdiction should Terri's husband, Michael, have here? What happened to his pledge to stand by her "in sickness and in health?" The record shows that years ago he abandoned Terri, moved in with his girlfriend and had children. He could easily have divorced Terri and left her in her parents' care rather than cheating on her. How does Pinellas Circuit Court Judge Greer allow a man who is living with, and has children with, another woman, to make life-and-death decisions concerning his disabled wife? This shocks basic common sense!

I am not an expert in the law or the complexities of custody rights, or a medical analysis of a Persistent Vegetative State versus a Minimally Conscious State. But I know right from wrong. I know our Creator values human life. I know that for a government official, a judge who is our servant, to Order the murder of a woman because she cannot feed herself, by starving her to death against the wishes of her mother and father who care for her is a crime against Man and God.

Beside murder, Judge Greer is committing another felony: violation of his Oath of Office which says he must uphold the Constitution and the unalienable right of every individual to Life, Liberty, and Pursuit of Happiness. And if we allow this judge to get away with Ordering murder and violation of his Oath, like so many other crooked judges nationwide have been allowed immunity for their criminal actions, the blood of this victim is on everyone's soul who failed to try to stop it by at least speaking out against it because the government agent, judge Greer, is our servant acting in our name.

Remember the famous quotation of Pastor Martin Niemöller concerning moral failure in the face of the Nazis: "First they came for the Communists, but I was not a Communist, so I said nothing. Then they came for the Social Democrats, but I was not a Social Democrat, so I did nothing. Then came the trade unionists, but I was not a trade unionist. And then they came for the Jews, but I was not a Jew, so I did little. Then when they came for me, there was no one left to stand up for me."

## IRS Terrorism

Tax preparation organizations (and others) are dutifully parroting the IRS terror campaign, and the government controlled media is printing government propaganda as if it's "news." Of course, if you try to ask the the IRS questions about how you SHOULD determine what tax you owe, you will get threats and insults, and then the silence treatment.

Their attitude of "might makes right" creeps into almost everything they send out, in the form of "if you believe you don't owe, and act on it, you could be subject to fines or even prosecution." We've grown so accustomed to the IRS as a terrorist organization, that it seems normal to us—AUWE!

In the IRS's rhetoric, NO ONE ever has an honest disagreement about the proper application of the law. Civilized people allow other people to disagree without trying to inflict suffering on them. The IRS has zero tolerance.

And don't fool yourself: the methods of the IRS are, first and foremost, not about collecting money owed, but about INFLICTING SUFFERING. What are all the fines and prosecutions about? Why have to pay more for disagreeing with them about something? Because they want to DETER disagreement, and the only way to do that is to HURT people for disagreeing.

And that's why they prosecute people (including me). They have to respond to honest dissent viciously, to keep their game going. Do you think anyone in the system could look at my case, and conclude that I don't believe what I'm saying? Of course not. And how do they respond? By trying to HURT people for BELIEVING something the government doesn't like.

Next, does anyone think it's unreasonable for those in government to INSULT AND THREATEN citizens for asking them? I do. But that's all the IRS ever do.

So why is it that those who question "popular opinion" are being completely open and honest about their beliefs, while those in government and the tax preparation industry are refusing to have rational discussions, and are instead resorting to insulting and threatening people? Which side looks like a "scam" to you?

## CHOICES Program gives youths a taste of time in jail? Instead, try the FREEDOM choice: the Bill of Rights!

Seventh-grader Kamani Pali had never been scared about visiting prison until she went on a school field trip to Maui Community Correctional Center. Pali, a student at Kalama Intermediate School, had spent many Sundays visiting her father in an isolated room at MCCC. But she never toured the jail cells and met female inmates who openly talked about what led them to a life of crime.

The experience she gained from a program called Choices has got Pali rallying behind her teachers to implement a program that would require troubled students to visit MCCC. I think it be good for the troublemakers, Pali said. [Police State success!]

Well, maybe instead try teaching the students about their freedoms and power so they know their responsibilities, instead of just coercing them to stay in line? Students must learn that the solution to most of life's problems is up to them, because the Constitution was crafted with the intention to create a limited servant government, to perform 17 specific tasks --and nothing else! The People are the Sovereigns!

Students may respond positively to individual sovereignty, and make a commitment to freedom as did our Founding Fathers in the Declaration of Independence: We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness. That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed. **Molokai Junior Lifeguard Program Starts**

The Junior Lifeguard Program is an American Red Cross sponsored lifeguard training program that offers students 15 through 18 years of age the opportunity for certification in lifeguard training, first aid and CPR for the professional rescuer.

Course prerequisites include a 500-yard continuous swim (200-yard front crawl, 100-yard breast stroke and 200-yards of either); a 20-yard swim incorporating a surface dive to a depth of seven to 10 feet to retrieve a 10-pound object, return to the surface, and swim back to the starting point.

Class dates are March 28 through April 1, Monday through Friday, from 9a.m. to 3 p.m., at Cooke Memorial Pool. There is a program fee of \$44.95, payable to the American Red Cross and covers training materials.

Class sizes are limited to 10 students, but if under-enrolled, the class will consider accepting ages 19 and up. Students are asked to register with the lifeguards at Cooke Memorial Pool; students must be registered to be wait-listed.


