Hawaii must stop Taser use on children

Shame on the big bad cop who used a potentially lethal weapon on a teenager in Hilo (Honolulu Advertiser, Taser used on teen at school, 4/18/2009).

The Taser is a potentially lethal weapon, though police commonly lie and call it "nonlethal." But a teenager of almost the same age as the Hilo student was killed in Michigan last week by police using a Taser for no reason.

The family of 16-year-old Robert Mitchell plan to file a wrongful death lawsuit alleging that police used excessive force when they struck the unarmed, 5 foot tall, 125-pound teenager with a Taser stun gun last week. The family believes the shock delivered by the Taser ultimately led to the teen's death, which may be the third teen Taser death this year, and the second in the past 30 days in the state of Michigan. Yes, another teen death. This one involved a passenger in a car who fled when the police pulled it over for expired license plates. That's right, he wasn't even the driver. He was just a scared kid. He committed no crime. Now he's dead. His name is Robert Mitchell, he had a learning disability, and he died after he was struck with a Taser by police in Warren, Michigan. The teen fled police after a traffic stop for an expired license plate and ran into an abandoned building to hide, where police struck him with the stun gun while apprehending him.

Last month, another Michigan teen died after being struck by a Taser gun in Bay City. Brett Elder, who was 15 years old at the time of his death, was struck after he started to fight with officers while they were attempting to intervene in a dispute between the teen and another person.

According to witnesses, Elder was "flopping around" on the ground after being struck by the Taser and an emergency medical crew was called. Upon his arrival at the hospital, the 15 year old was pronounced dead.

Elder was also a small kid and like Robert Mitchell, also suffered from a learning disability. So now we have a dead 15-year old, a dead 16-year old kid. Regardless, Big Island police shot a 17-year old keiki with a deadly Taser gun.

Reports of the number of adult Taser deaths vary from 350 to 403 deaths attributed to Taser use since 2001. Whatever the correct number, it's clear that the Taser kills. Regardless, in Hawaii, and Nationwide, police use the Taser too casually, as if it were a harmless magic ray gun.

A Florida adult case started as a traffic ticket. Washington County Deputy Sheriff Rackard ordered Mr. Buckley to sign the receipt for the ticket, but Buckley refused to sign it. The sheriff handcuffed Buckley who then burst into tears. The Deputy shot Buckley with the Taser and he died. Fortunately for all Americans, Deputy Rackard didn't remember that his video camera was on and the evidence of police Taser brutality and homicide is undeniable.

Tasers are widely misused. In December 2008, Amnesty released a report that found 90% of all Taser gun deaths examined involved people who were unarmed and did not appear to present a serious threat to officers. In addition, a number of deaths have been associated with inappropriate use of the weapons, such as repeated firings, shocks that last longer than five seconds or delivering a charge to the neck or head.

Back to cops tasing children: So we have a dead 15-year old, a dead 16-year old, and yet Big Island police shot a 17-year old and this incident of torture was witnessed by local students in Hilo.

Andrea Shaw, the grandparent of a Keaau High student, learned of the incident as it happened when her granddaughter's cell phone received a text message: "OMG, I just saw someone get Tased," Shaw said. "I wouldn't want my child witnessing that kind of thing," Shaw said. "It's traumatizing."

Yes, traumatizing is the word. Maybe even PTSD. Watching someone screaming and writhing in pain on the ground is a horrible experience (unless maybe you're a cop?). That's not what kids should be experiencing in school.

Kids are smarter than cops. They know that Tasers can kill. They read widely on the Internet, where it's no secret. They know that the police could have killed that Big Island student. Concerned citizens should be outraged and demand criminal prosecution of cops who use these deadly weapons irresponsibly.

I know that police are seldom held accountable for their actions, why not nail it down in the law that any police officer using a Taser resulting in death or injury will be charged with manslaughter? Let them defend themselves in court: its the right to Life and self defense denied to their victim, when cops are executioners.

A United Nations committee said that use of Taser weapons can be a form of torture, in violation of the U.N. Convention Against Torture. The use of TaserX26 weapons, provoking extreme pain, constituted a form of torture, and that in certain cases it could also cause death, as shown by several reliable studies and by certain cases that had happened after practical use.

Yet, The Honolulu Star-Bulletin reported that there will be more Taser-equipped police on campus to watch for truancy and fights. **MAKAALA ~!**

HELLO! Truancy is NOT a capital offense in Hawaii, nor is it necessary to have police enforce the truancy laws on campus. Increasing the number of police indicates a failure on the part of the school administration and also the DOE to provide a safe environment for education. They have not solved whatever problems there are, they are just hoping to escape their responsibilities by using the threat of police violence against students. What is the school doing about behavioral issues that might be effective in preventing the call for more cops?

Tasing a student is a serious failure on its own right, and doing so in front of other students caused significant harm to them, too. What is DOE/cops thinking?

Ceded Land Ruling: Apology Resolution has no Legal Effect on Admission Act.

re: Hawaii v. OHA (SCOTUS March 31, 2009)

Background. In 1893, the Hawaiian Kingdom was replaced with the Republic of Hawaii. Under the Newlands Resolution of 1898, Congress proclaimed that the Republic of Hawaii ceded Government and Crown Lands to the federal government in fee. In 1900, the Territory of Hawaii was established and Congress passed the Organic Act of 1900, which made clear that the new Territory consisted of the land that the United States acquired in 'absolute fee. In 1959, Congress admitted Hawaii to the Union through the Admissions Act. The Admissions Act stated that the United States granted to the State of Hawaii the title to all the public lands and other public property within the boundaries of the State of Hawaii that was held by the United States. Admission Act § 5(b). Public lands were held in trust to promote public purposes like the betterment of Native Hawaiians, developing home ownership, and public education. Admission Act § 5(f). Under state law, the State could alienate these lands provided that the proceeds went to those purposes. In 1993, Congress passed the Apology Resolution, a separate political statement.

Former crown lands on Maui were held by the State. The Housing Finance and Development Corporation (HFDC) was permitted to remove the parcel and sell them to develop affordable housing. The HFDC was required to compensate the Office of Hawaiian Affairs funds from the sale of those lands. OHA sued for an injunction on the alienation of the lands on the grounds that there was a cloud on the title for Hawaiian ownership rights. The trial court ruled against OHA, but the Hawai'i Supreme Court vacated. According to the HSC, a plain reading of the Apology Resolution . . . dictated the vacation. The HSC ordered an injunction on all ceded lands until the claims of the Native Hawaiians were resolved. The State appealed to the Supreme Court of the United States.

Federal Question Jurisdiction Found because the HSC relied so heavily on the pronouncements of the Apology Act, i.e., the "whereas" clauses in the Resolution--clauses that have no operative effect, it was clear to the SCOTUS that the HSC did not come to its decision on independent state law grounds thereby exposing its decision to federal appellate review.

Justice Alito, writing for an unanimous court, noted that the Apology Resolution had no effect on the State's powers. Congress's Apology used verbs that were "conciliatory or precatory," such as Congress acknowledged, apologized, expressed commitment, recognized, and commended things. Such terms are not the kind that Congress uses to create substantive rights. Also, Congress cannot, after statehood, reserve or convey submerged lands that have already been bestowed upon a State.

Back to Hawai'i on Remand. The SCOTUS reversed the judgment of the HSC and remanded for further proceedings. This means that the HSC will have a chance to write an opinion that comes to the same conclusion--the State cannot alienate ceded lands--but on independent state grounds, and thus be shielded from federal review providing the State's revised opinion does not violate the Admission Act or the United States Constitution.

Not only does the Admission Act convey title to the State in "absolute fee," but title is held in a public trust, i.e., the uses of the land must be for certain public uses ranging from education to Native Hawaiians. So does this mean that OHA can bring a breach-of-trust action against the State for the alienation of lands?

State Rep. Mele Carroll, whose district includes East Maui, Molokai and Lanai, said there is hope with legislation pending at the state Capitol to protect ceded lands until a sovereign Hawaiian government is organized.

[Editor's note: Does Mele Carroll forget her Oath to support and defend the Constitution for the united States of America by supporting instead creation of a race based governing entity? I think so, obviously!!]

Rep. Betram Dares to challenge D.A.R.E ! and MPD Thomas Phillips is Offended?

And Rep. Joe Betram is right: DARE is an ineffective program beloved by police departments and DOE. However, it doesn't work. It's ineffective in preventing drug use. California doesn't let DARE into its schools. And it's a waste of state and city money (and not eligible for federal funding).

State Rep. Joe Bertram III, D-11th (Mākena, Wailea, Kihei) has now angered the Maui Police Department, pretty much the same as Molokai resident and MPD critic George Peabody editor for The MANonline [aka The MAN]

Bertram sent a letter to Maui police on suggesting, in these tough economic times, that they stop funding Drug Abuse Resistance Education [DARE] and the marijuana eradication task force program.

The representative, who wants to expand the state's medical marijuana program, wrote that DARE has proven unsuccessful and the marijuana eradication program "infringes on the privacy of medical marijuana patients and the noise is a disturbance of the peace."

The Maui Police Department's response from Deputy Chief Gary Yabuta is, "We were quite aware of Representative Bertram's position on the legalization of marijuana issue; however, we find his criticism of the DARE Program offensive."

OFFENSIVE !! Hell, the MPD War on Drugs-goon squads are OFFENSIVE; Tasering people is deadly offensive, false arrests, lies, tampering with evidence, perjury are daily MPD offensive actions, says George Peabody, who got the MPD "offensive" reactions over the past years regarding War on Drugs, and now MPD captan "Jody" has put him on a reject list of those excluded from MPD email communications because of criticism of MPD's abuses of citizens, violating the Constitution, racketeering, and some factual information about her president Obama's fraud and treason that require police enforcement action that she won't initiate. The problem is that the Maui police have had too much invested in DARE for a long time, and have pulled the wool over parents' eyes on its lack of effectiveness. Oh, yes. How offensive it would be if the parents who stick those DARE bumper stickers on their car who have been misled to thinking that their children are now drug-proofed, if the parents found out the truth that kids learn more about drugs to try out through DARE!

Cops have become addicted to the money they get for the program and they love how DARE teaches children to rat on their parents. [DARE graduate called the police on his mother after finding marijuana in the house, receives a \$1,000 thank you to drug busters. A criminal justice report called DARE a failure earlier this year. In April, Mass. Lt Governor Kerry Healey said she would not recommend resurrecting state funding for the DARE program. State funding for DARE was cut in 2002 by Acting Governor Jane Swift from \$4.3 million to \$200,000.

Imagine instead that students understood the need for prevention and treatment and encouraged parents with drug problems to seek help.

So yes, DARE should be discontinued on Maui and anywhere else in Hawaii where that particular con is active. We The People SHOULD "offend the police". Rep. Joe Bertram is right. George Peabody is right. Lets OFFEND MPD !
