

Molokai Public Library's 70th Anniversary Celebrated

It has served the Molokai community for more than 70 years! The Molokai Public Library, now with Librarian Sri TenCate at the helm for more than ten years, celebrated with special entertainment and displays on Wednesday, May 16th. Beginning at 1pm in the afternoon, with welcome by Librarian Sri TenCate, emcee Todd Yamashita introduced Kahu Anna Lou Arakaki who gave the opening blessing. Reading a congratulatory letter from State Librarian JoAnn Schindler, Acting public librarian Timothy Littlejohn followed up with classical guitar musical dedication. photo at right, Librarians from Oahu's Leeward Coast were special guests. Molokai composer Lono followed up with special music telling of Ili'iliopae Heiau, Moloka'i paniolo and other mo'olelo. (photo top left) Regular Wednesday visitors the Kaunakakai After School Program offered a special cheer and "Hip, Hip, Hooray!"



Other entertainment by Badenyaa with Afro-cuban Drum and Dance, The Tau Dance Theatre with Dances from Hawai'i & the Pacific Rim came with support from the Hawaii State Foundation on Culture and the Arts. Molokai favorites 'O Hina i Ka Malama Hawaiian Immersion program from the Molokai High & Middle School completed the outdoor performances. The evening ended with Children's Story time featuring *Charlotte's Web* ad Crafts.

Indoors, Molokai artists and craftspersons displayed woodwork, paintings, quilting and kites.

The history of Molokai Public Library was recalled by emcee Todd Yamashita -- beginning in 1929 with 300 books and the present Art Deco style historic site built in 1937. Yamashita said the library was officially opened when Mrs. Bella cut the ribbon opening the doors of the building which then cost a total of \$16,000! A new expansion planned for the near future, will cost much more than that! Though small, the Molokai Public Library and the staff of five provide more than books, videos, CDs, Internet Access, computer access for the visually handicapped, and many other services. Late in 2006, a new bookmobile replaced the grand old bookmobile (pictured with Driver Alan Apostol, below) continues visiting the schools at Maunaloa, Kualapuu and Kilohana.



Dressed in their cheerful red shirts, Molokai Friends of the Library served cookies and punch and are among the supporters of regular book sales and the Wednesday Afternoon Reading Partners. Our Community Library opens the world for Molokai residents through Books and special events. 



The goal of the founders of America was to restrict government within severe limits and to protect the rights of sovereign individuals. Government has NO rights!





Crime and Punishment: government agents commit crimes

"Tyranny will come to your door wearing a uniform." wrote Jack McLamb, a Retired Police Officer. If you are arrested, jailed, prosecuted, fined, imprisoned, maybe a crime was committed against you by your servant government.

Before we can discuss crime and punishment, we must first understand what a crime is: unless there is a human victim intentionally damaged, there can be no crime; statutory crimes can only apply to corporations and other artificial creations of government.

Let us say you accidentally damage your neighbor's house, perhaps because your lawn mower picked up a rock and threw it through a window on your neighbor's house. Was a crime committed?

Let us say you pick up a rock and intentionally throw it through your neighbor's window. Was a crime committed?

Let us say that you intentionally exceeded the posted speed limit and nothing happens except that you traveled rapidly on our highways. Was a crime committed?

Let us say that you speed intentionally and intentionally smash into another's car? Was a crime committed?

Let us say that you use marijuana. Do you commit a crime?

Let us say that you had a taillight out and some law enforcer stopped you and gave you a ticket? Have you committed a crime? More important, was a crime committed?

What if you fail to show up at a municipal court for violation of some city or county ordinance or some other bill of pains and punishments enacted by the state legislature? Have you committed a crime?

The answer to most of these is, No, you haven't committed a crime, but the State, city or county has committed a crime against you if you were arrested, tried, fined, and/or incarcerated.

Our prisons are full of people who have committed no crime, roughly 70 to 80 percent. When one understands "redress to the victim" or "redress that may be granted upon a claim", the fact that government is filling privatized prison systems and treating non-crimes as crimes in order to facilitate revenue collection becomes clear. Prisons and jails are money-makers for the controllers.

When one understands the true intention of prosecuting "crimes" and how the de facto governments and quasi governments (city and county chartered corporate "governments") have distorted justice and the philosophies behind claims to which redress may be granted, one will understand more completely the meaning of justice and the justice system. True justice, you see, is not to be confused with the horrible mess our people are now subjected to for both "crimes" and "non-crimes".

Always, without fail, we must ask, "qui bono", or who benefits when we discuss crime, punishment, and the victim in the case of a bona fide crime. When this question is answered, one easily comes to realize that we people have allowed the de facto governments to establish "rule" over us.

When I was maybe nine years old, I stole a package of gum from a small grocery store.

Did I commit a crime? Yes, I did.

Did the victims get redress? Yes, they did.

Did public servants or any corporation profit? No.

Was justice served? Yes, it was.

Was all made right by the actions taken against me? Yes.

Was I handcuffed, treated like a crazed animal and jailed? No.

In fact, were any ignorant/arrogant law enforcer, prosecuting attorney (the bane of a free society), and judge involved? No, and not even a peace officer was involved.

And, yet, the writer has the audacity to state that justice was served. How can that be?

Another time the writer shot out 40 streetlights with his air pistol? Was a crime committed? Yes.

Was a peace officer involved? Yes, the Chief of Police.

Was I handcuffed and taken to jail? No.

Did the victims receive redress? Yes.

Who were the victims? The lights owned by Public.

Did the state legislatively created corporate CITY OF BROOKFIELD Government profit? No.

Was justice served? Yes.

Was all made right with redress to the victims and the one damaging them punished? Yes.

What is the difference then to now as medical marijuana users families are raided by SWAT teams with automatic gun, and kids are arrested, fingerprinted, and jailed for pretending their fingers are guns or for other stupid excuses for controlling people?

The difference is that once upon a time in America justice was served rather than injustice against people. Also, there is now the use of terrorism by public servants to force compliance to ex post facto laws and bills of pains and punishments thereby committing crimes against the people.

The difference also is that corrupt government has created crimes when no crime exists. "Justice system" today is nothing but a racketeering business by what is called "courts", giving huge revenue amounts and unconstitutional control over people to government agents who commit the crimes against The People.

Unless there is a human victim intentionally damaged, there can be no crime. Only artificial persons can violate statutes and ordinances. In other words, statutory crimes can only apply to corporations and other artificial creations of government.

Without a damaged human being by another natural or artificial person, there is no human being to which redress may be granted.

Furthermore, the damage done to the human being or his property must be intentional and recognized as a crime. This includes murder (to which the people are the prosecutor, as in "The People v. Suspect"), burglary, assault, and rape, the four classes that the F.B.I. keeps stats on as offenses against the person.

Keep in mind that the purpose of redress is to offset the loss by the victim, whether it is a criminal act (with intention) or an accident.

To summarize, a crime was committed, only if:

1. There must be a human victim.
2. There must be the intention to harm another human or his property; otherwise, it is an accident.
3. The act must be defined as a crime, not by statutes, but by our Law, Nature's Law, which is easily derived from the Ten Commandments upon which our justice is based.

Should governments profit from crimes committed against others? No way! Being convicted of a crime should entail first and foremost redress to the victim.

The State government, for example, does not suffer a loss, as the people pay for our courthouses and all materials. Nor do the chartered City or County, since police and sheriffs are paid for by the people and are supposed to be servants protecting all of the rights of the people.

Can a victim get redress if the criminal is put in jail? No.

Does the government profit if the convicted is put in jail? Yes, it does, as reports on bail bonding, fines, property seized and sold, and currency seized clearly prove.

Fines do not come to the victim. But the State uses prisoners as slave laborers for corporations, and the fact that one of the biggest complaints the writer has heard is that goods were recovered but the victim never got anything back.

In fact, CBS a few years ago ran a television special on Louisiana law enforcement. The judge received 50 percent, the prosecuting attorney 30 percent, and the arresting officer(s) 20 of the proceeds from fines and property confiscation.

In regard to recovered goods, the writer knows for a fact this happens, as it has happened to him. In 1977 or 1978, his home was broke into. The Johnson County, Missouri Sheriff told him the burglar had been caught and his goods recovered. After two years of trying to get my stuff back, I finally gave up, figuring the people in the sheriff's department was going to keep it or had already sold it. Either way, I received no redress and never even found out if the guy had been convicted.

Anyway, readers have enough information to answer the above questions and many others for them selves. After answering them, think "qui bono" who or what benefits from making millions of rules falsely turning nearly everyone into criminals, except those writing and enforcing statutes upon the people who are the criminals, committing hundreds of thousands of bona fide crimes against the American people every year.


Think about that the next time you pay a fee to exercise a right or pay a fine for exercising a right.

“There are three possible scenarios for burials at La‘au,” said Hawaiian burials expert Hale Aloha Ayau. “First, there is choke burials at La‘au, second there are a few burials of only very important people, or third a combination of both choke burials and very important people buried at La‘au.”

“Burials were placed at the western or setting of the sun portions of the islands, as death was not the end, but the beginning of the next life.

Burials were placed in the fetal position, as we were at birth. Sandy areas were preferred burial sites.

On Molokai, Mo‘omomi and La‘au would be the two optimal burial areas.”

OHA in their letter dated 2/23/07 in response to the La‘au Draft EIS, states, “OHA urges the applicant to actually re-survey the areas--the Moloka‘i Island Burial Council has been defunct for more than two and a half years, creating another serious concern about any proposed mitigation or burial treatment plans.”

Sacred is La‘au, home of the people’s chief Kiha a Pi‘ilani who has a pu‘u at La‘au named after him, where at one time there was a spring, from which barren women drank and were then able to conceive. Kiha a Pi‘ilani also restored the fishponds of Molokai and built the famous Kaluakoi road ike Alapupu i Moloka‘i, which was lined with white coral. Kaiakea, ruling chief of Molokai, keeper of the Kalaipahoa of sorcery fame and maker of the famous well at Kalaeokala‘au, which was dug with Pahoa adz. Paka‘a keeper of the famous wind gourd La‘amaomao, in which were contained all of the winds of Hawaii frequented La‘au.

OHA also states in their 2/23/07 letter, “The CIA (Cultural Impact Assessment) acknowledges that the La‘au area is generally regarded as a special place of spiritual mana and power. It is raw and un-touched, this factor gives La‘au an almost mythical quality, a rural strong hold and reserve of Native Hawaiian culture, a cultural Kipuka. If Moloka‘i is the last Hawaiian Island, then La‘au is one of the last untouched Hawaiian places on the last Hawaiian Island. The CIA states quite clearly that La‘au is an extremely sacred place, that should not be desecrated.”

If our OHA trustee refuses to listen to her people, then hopefully she will listen to her own staff.

Lingle Allows DU in HAWAII

Depleted uranium unit came from a recoilless rifle capable of firing a 76-pound nuclear bomb, the Pentagon confirmed for the first time.

The Army report said that the rifle's "spotting rounds," were used at Schofield Barracks and possibly at Makua Military Reservation and Pohakuloa Training Area on the Big Island. Apparently the nuclear bomb warhead itself was not fired in Hawaii. The warhead had the strength of two to four times the explosive power that destroyed an Oklahoma City federal building in 1995.



[see "Public Safety, Public Spending: Forecasting America's Prison Population 2007-2011," forecas growth of 13 percent during the time period, triple the projected growth of the United States population in general. By 2011, one in every 178 Americans, more than 1.7 million inmates, will be in prison at projected rates, that will require \$15 billion in new operating costs and \$12.5 billion in new construction costs to handle the report says.]

Among the fifty states, evidence shows that South Dakota is the fastest growing prison state. One would think that South Dakota would be more interested in corn, milk and cattle, not prisons, but the greatest commodity of South Dakota is buying, selling and trading prisoners with other states.

It deals in supplying prisoners for the private prison industry which is big business in South Dakota, its greatest asset is its prison industry. Who benefits? State Senators own a catering industry that held a contract with South Dakota for supplying the concessions to all the prisoners in the state. And, these prisons offer incentives for their prisoners to build more prisons. And, those prisoners who did not build prisons, are offered incentives to work in manufacturing goods such as cabinets, flooring: They are turning their civilization into a prison-manufacturing industry, and they don't want anything like JAIL or the Bill of Rights that will disrupt their massive cash-cow industry.
