## Hawaiians Protest Akaka Bill

Gov. Linda Lingle and Sens. Daniel K. Inouye and Daniel K. Akaka are supporting the Akaka Bill now in the US Senate, contrary to native Hawaiian activists like Bumpy Kanahela who want nothing less than total independence from the United States.

The legislation would lead to federal recognition of native Hawaiians. Andre Perez, Hui Pu coordinator: "The Akaka Bill will attempt to empower the Department of the Interior to act as our sovereign and we all know that is completely bogus. The Akaka bill fails to address our sovereign heritage as an independent and free people."

"Unfortunately, the Akaka Bill does not go far enough," said Hui Pu member Moanikeala Akaka. "The problem with the bill is we can not trust America to begin with - they not trust worthy," said Bumpy Kanahela, a long time Hawaiian sovereignty activist who is lending support to Hui Pu. Lehua Yim points out, there are no guarantees in wardship politics between native peoples and the federal government.

"The Clinton administration recognized the Nipmuc Tribe of central Massachusetts, and then the recognition was reversed by Bush," Yim says. "So here's a case of those who got and then were later denied federal recognition. It's important that we analyze the costs as well as the benefits of the Akaka Bill."

Land ownership is a major concern to Hawaiians, but Sen. Akaka's press secretary Cardus is emphatic. "This bill explicitly has nothing to do with land settlements."

"It's true that S. 746 says that it isn't a settlement of any claims in the same way that the government recognizes American Indians and Native Alaskans. It would also initiate a process under which native Hawaiians could set up their own government, giving them the same nation-within-a-nation status as Indian tribes.

The Akaka Bill did not get its expected vote in the Senate last week, and its prospects are uncertain as Hawaiians' opposition to the Akaka Bill continued to grow.

Hawaii's senators, Daniel Inouye and Daniel Akaka, report that at least six senators have concerns about the Native Hawaiian Government Reorganization Act of 2005 and have asked that a vote on the measure be postponed. Akaka found himself arguing the bill with senators who he said told him they "didn't think it would be good for Hawaiians." Senator Akaka, who has championed federal recognition for a native Hawaii government for six years, said the news "was disheartening."

"The message from leadership is they will not let us go forward. It is very disappointing to me. We have worked for many, many years just trying to get it to the floor for a vote," Akaka said.

Akaka Bill opponent H. William Burgess, a Honolulu attorney who has worked on cases challenging Hawaiian preferences, said the measure's troubles in the Senate did not surprise him: "...the more people contemplate and see what the bill really does, the more likely it is they're going to say it's impossible to do this."

Ikaika Hussey, a spokesman for the Hawaiian sovereignty coalition Hui Pu, which also opposes the measure, said he also hopes that a delay would result in more study of the bill. Hui Pu members believe the Akaka Bill does not reflect the views of many native Hawaiians.

"The most important thing is that we use the time that the delay is creating to really push the Senate to hold hearings in Hawaii on the bill," Hussey said. "It's a minimum requirement as a democracy."

Gambling appears to be a big sticking point in the Senate, but there are other issues that might have nothing to do with native Hawaiians.

Inouye and Akaka said they have assured colleagues that the Akaka Bill would start a process to form a native Hawaiian government, but it would take more than a decade to accomplish.

Supporters of the bill said they will wait to see what Akaka and Inouye get done in the coming week. "There is a chance the bill will still be passed this term. We have every confidence that Sen. Akaka and Sen. Inouye will do everything they can," said Clyde Namuo, executive director of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs [OHA].

But U.S. Rep. Ed Case said the new Senate objections raise concerns for the bill to get out of the House. Case, like Inouye and Akaka, predicts that the Akaka Bill has enough support to pass if it is put up to a vote.

Aware of the reality of how tenuous the flow of federal money is to Native Hawaiian institutional recipients, OHA, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands and any number of nonprofit organizations benefiting from the federal dollars rallied some Hawaiians to push ahead with plans for federal recognition to keep the money flowing. Despite the hundreds of millions of dollars sitting in OHA accounts and billions more in Hawaiian trusts, Hawaiians still have the same problems they had 100 years ago.

There are three Akaka Bills: Senate Bill 2899 (Akaka Bill No. 1), the legislation was the subject of oral and written testimony from the Hawaiian community at hearings held in Hawai'i in August 2000. Four months later, Sen. Akaka unveiled another bill. Senate Bill 746 (Akaka Bill No. 2) created lots of division and confusion inside the Hawaiian community. The salient change that differentiated this bill from its predecessor was the removal of economic self-sufficiency language — considered by many to have been a key part of the original bill. The consensus among Hawaiian activists was that S. 746 was a powerful piece of legislation that would perpetuate a semifunctional Hawaiian wardship indefinitely in exchange for federal recognition ... i.e., federal protection. The discord within the Hawaiian community — and the lack of trust many Hawaiians already felt toward the delegation representing them in Washington — increased threefold with the drafting of yet a third bill, S. 1783 or Akaka Bill No. 3.

Veteran activist Kekuni Blaisdell, coordinator of the Hawaiian sovereignty roundtable, KaPākākau, agrees. "These bills violate our inherent right to self-determination," he says, "and place us under U.S. federal Indian law, creating a process whereby we have a puppet government that has to be acceptable to the Secretary of the Interior and approved by the state of Hawai'i. It is worse than what we have now. This legislation exists for the purposes of having kākā maoli go on record as formally relinquishing our rights to our sovereignty and our lands," Blaisdell says.

Ikaika Hussey is chair of the subcommittee for the Akaka Bill Working Group. He, too, has grown disaffected with the "process." "... this has been a congressionally driven bill." [Editor's Note: a Ward of the state is not a Sovereign Individual.]

## Hawaii's Public Libraries Go Digital

The Hawaii State Public Library System (HSPLS) announces its latest online service which offers local customers 24/7/365 access to an online collection of downloadable audio books and eBooks using their home Internet connections.

This online service provides the state's diverse population with new popular reading and listening options. Customers can choose from hundreds of digital books including self-help, legal resources, mysteries and thrillers, cookbooks, travel guides, business, computer books, and many other popular subjects. Technology for the new service is provided through OverDrive, the national leader in downloadable media for libraries.

To check out a digital book, customers visit the online library (<http://hawaii.lib.overdrive.com>), install the free reader software, make their selections, enter their HSPLS library card, and then download the titles. When the lending period is over, the digital books are automatically returned, so there are no late fees. If all of the copies are checked out, customers can place a "hold" and receive an email notification when the title is available. A valid Hawaii State Public Library System card is required to borrow and download eBooks and digital audio books from the website. Guides to the eBook and digital audio book services are available at [www.librarieshawaii.org/services/ebooks.htm](http://www.librarieshawaii.org/services/ebooks.htm).

State Librarian Jo Ann Schindler points out the advantages of this new digital collection: "For the customer, this means no traffic and parking hassles, 24/7 access on all islands, automatic returns, no overdues, no fines, email notification, no delivery delays, and increased privacy. For the staff, benefits include no physical space requirements, no re-shelving, no processing, no lost or damaged items, no shipping costs, timely order fulfillment, and immediate borrowing statistics. These are major improvements for our library system, which has limited staffing, but which is nevertheless trying to meet the needs of library users who have wide-ranging reading interests and active lifestyles. As the technology matures and the publishers' digital offerings increase, we expect even greater service improvements for our customers," Schindler said.

## Enforce the Bill of Rights !

**Second Amended as proposed by the Framers in 1789**

Legal cit: "The provision in the Constitution granting the right to all persons to bear arms is a limitation upon the power of the Legislature to enact any law to the contrary. The exercise of a right guaranteed by the Constitution cannot be made subject to the will of the sheriff. [People vs. Zerillo, 219 Mich. 635, 189 N.W. 927, at 928 (1922)]"

The Second Amendment of 1789 and 1791, and, from 1791 until 1950, was a real, snarly, viable, effective Second Amendment, a real deterrent to a rogue government. That was a Second Amendment that empowered ordinary citizens to retain the pragmatic means to hold the government bureaucracy to limits, to have the pragmatic means to defend against the common criminal, and to have the pragmatic means to defend self, loved ones, community, state, and nation--to deter all Aggressors, all Tyrants, and all Foreign Invaders.

That was a Second Amendment that promoted real Homeland Security--an armed population--one that was skilled in arms and was trusted by the Government--a Government that trusted the People because the People appreciated that the Government took their rights seriously and did not pose a viable threat to their rights.

But the Federal Ninth Circuit Court has held that the Second Amendment does not guarantee an individual right to arms but only a right of the States to maintain a National Guard. Did the judges who engineered this change function as "Guardians of Liberty"? Your liberty? Or, did they function as "Apologists For Statists Who Usurped Power And Constricted Liberty By Perverting The Constitutional Rule Of Law"? Did they function as traitors? Did their ruling give aid and comfort to this nation's domestic and foreign enemies?

If you wanted to invade, seize, occupy, control, and dominate the continental United States, which would you prefer: To have to cope with the U.S. Armed Forces augmented by a widely armed U.S. civilian population? Or, in the alternative, would you rather have to cope only with the U.S. Armed Forces, lead by a leadership that was dumb enough to disarm the civilian population--an act that would motivate many U.S. citizens to not fight to preserve the government that disarmed them? Why should a U.S. civilian population fight against a foreign invader to protect a domestic government that strips them of their vital birthrights as declared in the Bill of Rights? If judges can pervert the Constitutional law this way, just cut the Second out of the Constitution by perverting it, with the blessings of Congress and Presidents, how safe are we? How safe are we from our officials? How many "American Hitlers" are already office holders?

Forget foreign terrorists! Domestic terrorists are our own government officials,

many of whom are senior level government officials . . . many of whom are called judges. Take a hard look at how the Second Amendment has been perverted by those who want to interpret the Second to eliminate an individual right to arms. Per this radical perversion of the Second, what happened to "civilian control" of the Armed Forces? How can disarmed civilians "control" an Armed Forces with a monopoly on arms?

If they can pervert the Second Amendment this way, what will stop them from perverting the First Amendment? Fourth Amendment? The Fifth? The Sixth? The Eighth?

What will stop them when they send Government Goons to destroy the printing presses? Or to confiscate media that finally states something material and unflattering about errant government officials?

What will stop them when they gut the Fourth Amendment, too, and make everyone subject to searches, without probable cause or reasonable suspicion? Its happening now at airports, subways, railways, bridges, and some highway stops.

How can a right be regulated without being infringed? Hell NO!

There is a material difference between prior restraint regulation and post abuse punishment for the criminal or civil negligent misuse of a firearm. The former, per "shall not be infringed," is unconstitutional whereas the later is constitutional.

Do you want to live with a government without a Bill of Rights to limit authority?



That would be a meaningful statement that underscores the importance of adhering to the Constitutional Rule of Law.

There are some Constitutional believing lawyers in America. Just a few, but they are out there with us. Of course when you try and arrest judges, or even suggest it, prepare for the worst. The criminals in government have NO HONOR, and certainly no integrity.

Legal cit: "The individual may stand upon his constitutional rights as a citizen. He is entitled to carry on his private business in his own way. His power to contract is unlimited. He owes no duty to the state or to his neighbors to divulge his business, or to open his doors to an investigation, so far as it may tend to criminate him. He owes no such duty to the state, since he receives nothing therefrom, beyond the protection of his life and property. His rights are such as existed by the law of the land long antecedent to the organization of the state, and can only be taken from him by due process of law, and in accordance with the Constitution. Among his rights are a refusal to incriminate himself, and the immunity of himself and his property from arrest or seizure except under a warrant of the law. He owes nothing to the public so long as he does not trespass upon their rights." HALE v. HENKEL, 201 U.S. 43 (1906)
