Molokai Special Olympics Athletes Bring Home The Honors

On the morning of August 20, 2005, 25 athletes, chaperones and special partners participated in the Special Olympics Hawaii Aukake Classic on Oahu. What an exciting time these Bocce and Soccer players had. The soccer team had to play twice to determine their division and one the first round, but tied in the second. Then later that same afternoon they played another two games to determine if they'll go on to the medal round. Well, all their practices here on Molokai and scrimmaging against our own Molokai High School varsity girls team sure paid off. They found themselves heading into Sunday's gold medal round playing against a tough Hilo team, who they had won the day before. What a game! Nearing the end of the game the score was zero to zero. With only little a minute left in the game and hoping to avoid the shut out, **Noel Motas scored the winning game point. Molokai won the gold medal!** Coaches (Teddy Sotelo and Mary Igarta) were surrounded by their players jumping and hugging each other. The players for the soccer team consisted of Akona and Kaniala Adolpho, Tom and Federico Galano, Ernest Kapu, Noel Motas, Benny Ragonton and Chyen and Christian Walker.

Aaron Legare's Honolulu Goodwill soccer team won Gold in their division.

The bocce team on Saturday played doubles (athletes/athletes) and they had to play several rounds to determine their division for that day. Special Olympics Molokai had three teams for the double, and they consisted of Molokai High School: Jazzlyn Bishaw and Theresa Greenleaf winning the gold, Team Molokai: Poliahu Purdy and Kenny Guy

won the Silver and Buddy System: Mark Kay and Lillian Galano took the Bronze.

On Sunday it was the unified teams (athletes/special partners) turn and they consisted of the Roxy Girls: Lillian Galano and Rachel Abshire: winning the Gold, Ho'olehua Girls: Jazzlyn and Donna Bishaw winning the Bronze. Homesteader: Poliahu Purdy and Alex Bishaw taking the Silver, Da Poi Guys: Mark Kay and Grandpa Marcellino fighting for and bringing home the gold against the Kaunakakai Girls: Theresa Greenleaf and Jonnette Spencer with the Silver and the Kawela West: Kenny Guy and Richard Rodriguez. It was such an exciting from the day before, but if you asked the team themselves they were all-the-way to win the gold medal.

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 19.04.040,

The County of Maui has released \$946,000 in grants for social service and educational activities in Maui County, Mayor Alan Arakawa announced today.

"Maui County has an exceptionally fine social service network," he said .

MEO also received \$13,000 for its Head Start Summer School Program on Molokai that offers summer school care to Molokai children three to five years of age whose families meet federal poverty income guidelines.

Hana Cultural Center received \$20,000 for basic support and its popular "Kupuna Tell Me a Story" oral history program that also provides videotaping and interview training for community members.

Obituary James Perry Kleeman




James Perry Kleeman of Kaunakakai and formerly Costa Mesa, California, died on Sunday, August 21, 2005. Jim was born on November 8, 1927, in Snyder, Nebraska. In 1942, he and his family moved to Salinas, California. During World War II, Jim served in the U.S. Navy. After the war, he met and married Anita Jean Black of Monterey, California in 1954. Over the next few years, he and Jane had three children, and moved to Southern California. In 1993, Jim and Jane moved to Molokai, Hawaii.

While residing on Molokai, Jim became very busy with several organizations on the island. He presided as the Chaplin and Vice Commander for the Veterans of Foreign Wars. Jim donated time at the Molokai Library in the "Molokai Reads Program." Also, he volunteered at the Retired Seniors Volunteer Program, served as the Nee Imua Treasurer and Vice President, AARP Treasurer and Community Coordinator, and served on the committee for Candidates Night and the Senior Center at Home Pumahana. He was a member of the Friends of the Library. Jim served on both the Molokai Main Street Association and the Molokai Island Main Street Association.

Jim has left behind his loving wife of fifty-one years, Jane; his children: Sandra (Kleeman) and Douglas Durand, Thomas Kleeman, and David Kleeman; and grandchildren: Michael and Kathleen Durand; and Eric Kleeman. He is also survived by his two sisters: Neoma Joyce Wyman and Peggy Lloyd.


Safety Concern: Vehicle headlights
