## INFLATION by Printing More Money!

## USDA/DLNR Says Manaba's Dirt Pile Must Be Returned to NRCS or Given to County

It started out as a \$20,000 contract with Detric Manaba to remove ironwood trees used as a windbrake from the USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service's Plant Materials site near the Molokai Airport, with the remains of the trees, if any, to be taken to the county landfill. But where did this large pile of very red dirt come from?

Witnesses said this pile of very red dirt [photo below by MAN] suddenly appeared in early September next to Detric Manaba's trucks and trailers across the street from Rawlin's Chevron, and they suspected it was not authorized. Maui County officials also said there is no record of any stockpiling permits being issued to Manaba for the site.

Upon investigation by The MAN, the NRCS employees confirmed that some red dirt was removed from the Plant Materials site by Manaba after he excavated ditches to bury the trees, and that he was told not to take any more. Manaba was not authorized to remove dirt from the site and sell it to other private parties, according to USDA contract officials in Honolulu who confirmed to The MAN that Manaba will have to comply with the law and the contract. However, at least three truck loads were sold and delivered by Manaba to a private party reportedly for about \$1200. DLNR says at this point they do not intend to take action against that innocent private party, and they just want Manaba to return the dirt to public property according to law.



State DLNR land management officer, Daniel Ornella told The MAN that it is illegal to remove natural resources from DLNR's lands, it is stealing from the public, even by a Lessee of public lands, much less by a Contractor who is supposed to adhere to the limits of the contract, and to know the laws regarding resource removal.

USDA's contract specialist Keith Harada and DLNR's Daniel Ornella reportedly gave Manaba two legal options: 1. return the dirt to the Plant Materials Center, or 2. deliver the dirt to the Maui County landfill.

Two weeks ago, Harada told The MAN that Manaba agreed to give the dirt to the County, and to contact Steven Arce for authorization and delivery options.

Since then, Arce says Manaba had not contacted him, though Arce did visit the stockpile a few times to try to contact Manaba. The dirt pile was flattened near to the 4 feet stockpiling of dirt regulations since the photo was taken, but apparently no permit to stockpile has yet been issued. And the dirt is not moving to the landfill, yet.

Why? Should Manaba move it, or should Taxpayers move Manaba's dirt pile?

## Constitution Day September 17, 2005: Read it or Lose it!

On Sept. 17, 1787, the Constitutional Convention, meeting in Philadelphia for four months, agreed on the final draft of this special, God Inspired Constitution for the United States of America and submitted to the several states for ratification.

It was ratified June 21, 1788, when New Hampshire approved it as the ninth state. Congress, acting under the Articles of Confederation, declared the Constitution the law of the land March 4, 1789.

By general assent and resolution of the Congress, Sept. 17 has been designated as Constitution Day ever since - designated, but few Americans even acknowledges Constitution Day anymore. That's tragic.

America has forgotten the two concepts that made her special as a nation - that set her apart from the world.

First, the Founding Fathers wrote a Constitution that strictly limited the role of the federal government in the lives of Americans. The idea that Washington had some role in education, redistribution of wealth, setting minimum wage requirements, nationalizing millions of acres of land, taxing income and subsidizing government-approved artists, or starting wars with foreign nations who had never attacked us, would have been anathema to the men who fought so valiantly for freedom against an over-reaching foreign tyranny - if they could have even imagined such abuses.

Secondly, the framers of that Constitution spoke eloquently about the fact that only a moral people - a nation of Godly

people with common spiritual and social values - were capable of self-government. They could not have envisioned the depths of depravity, licentiousness and vice to which our society has fallen - yet they warned about it. They WARNED about it!

Today's social and government policy seem disconnected from these two critical foundations of the American republic. Politicians will never solve our problems. Period. The more government tries to do, the worse things get.

And that's the beauty of the Constitution. It strictly limits what government can do. The trouble is that Americans have forgotten this. They've been dumbed down by government schools and a government-media complex to believe that Uncle Sam is there to solve all their problems - from how much they get paid, to what they spend on health care, to how they should raise their own children, even whether to defend themselves.

Why do we salute the flag and not the Constitution? The Constitution is every bit as symbolic as the flag, but it is much more - literally a guidepost to maintaining (or now, perhaps, to recovering) America's freedom. But it can only serve that function if we as a nation abide by it, pay heed to it, live by its code and its spirit.

Which symbol is really worth dying for? The flag is not my pick. After all, it is just a symbol. Symbols, of course, are important. But the Constitution is more. It is both symbol and substance. And its substance is being desecrated by some of those so piously concerned about the symbolic desecration of the flag.

A few years ago, a public opinion survey found that less than half of American adults would vote for the Constitution if it were on the ballot today. To that, I say, thank God there is no requirement for a democratic vote on the Constitution. Another poll showed close to half of Americans don't believe in the basic First Amendment guarantees of freedom of speech, assembly, religion and the press.

So, there you see it. The Constitution is being desecrated before our eyes. Here in one document are the guiding principles of our nation, the protections for us against a corrupt government succinctly and clearly stated. The Constitution, coupled with the Declaration of Independence, represents more of a national creed than a simple founding document for the nation.

Its about your individual sovereignty! Instead of reciting the Pledge to the flag in school everyday, that time could be better spent reading the Constitution so Americans know the government is their servant.

Under a Kaloa moon in the month of Ka'aona in the season of kauwela, on the shores of Kakuhihewa, our son **Na'iwa KuaPaka'a Pelikaokamana'o'i'o Kane Makaiwi Pescaia** was born on June 30, 2005. Arriving a full two months early he weighed 3lbs 15oz and was 16.5 in long.

He spent several weeks in the NICU at Kapi'olani Medical Center, but is now home with his 'ohana in Ho'olehua.

Na'iwa is the name of the traditional Makahiki grounds between Ho'olehua and Kualapu'u. For generations our families have cared for the oral traditions as well as the actual sites themselves. This year we celebrate the 25th modern games and commemorate our island community's effort to perpetuate our heritage. In the place name, Na'iwa refers to the 'iwa'iwa fern that once covered the area. His name also refers to the 'iwa birds of the sky, known guardians of our ancestral remains.

KuaPaka'a is the name of the son of Paka'a, a retainer of the high chief Keawenuia'Umi of Hawaii'I Island. KuaPaka'a had a wonderful gift of chant, and knew the names of every wind on every island, and was able to call them when he needed. He was a hard worker who cared for the family's 'uala fields at their house site near Halena, and was known for his hospitality.

Pelikaokamana'o'i'o means covenant of faith. Though born two days before we were to be sealed in the Kona Temple of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, we have complete faith our family will be made eternal real soon. Nothing can stop us!

Kane is an 'ohana name on both parents' sides and Makaiwi is an 'ohana name on dad's side. With a name longer than he was when he was born, we know our son will grow strong by the mana of each of his names, as well as the aloha our friends and family have shown us and will continue to show our son all the days of his life. Mahalo Molokai for your prayers, support and aloha, we are truly thankful for each of you that make Molokai this special place we enjoy.

Advocate for Residents Donovan Keliipuleole continues: As I speak with the residents I represent, it is obvious that Jersula and Roy are trying to fix everything in sight. However let me ask this, will the sudden burst of effort be enough to erase seven years of abuse? I must also state for the record that since the August 8th meeting the harassment and intimidation has gotten worse, this has led to the Contract Management Services filing new inquiries almost on a daily basis.
