## Air Molokai Returns -- Soon!

Hank Younge announced at the recent Aviation Career Day that Air Molokai will return to service soon. Henry Younge, Hank's son has been operating Molokai Air Shuttle since Hank "retired" 25 years ago. The new Air Molokai operated by both Younge's has been preparing with a new hanger, on Kaulele, off Lagoon Drive.

A waiting room, parking for patrons and a small snack shop will be completed soon. Hank told the M.A.N. that Air Molokai has seven planes and plans to offer service between Honolulu to Molokai and Maui. Pilots are in training and the hope is with increased passenger volume, to keep fares down in these days of fuel cost increases.

## Goohue Completes Air Force Basic

Air Force Cadet Edward K. Goodhue has completed Basic Cadet Training and earned the rank of cadet fourth class at the U.S. Air Force Academy, Colorado Springs, Colo. He is the son of Edward and Susan Goodhue of Kaunakakai, Hawaii. Goodhue is a 2004 graduate of Molokai High School, Hoolehua, Hawaii.

Goodhue is one of more than 1,300 men and women who completed the rigorous six-week orientation program. The training prepares cadets to enter their first academic year at the academy. The U.S. Air Force Academy curriculum offers education in the basics, engineering and social sciences, the humanities, and 30 other academic majors. At graduation, the cadet receives a bachelor of science degree and a commission of second lieutenant in the Air Force.

## Real Property Tax Scam in Maui County

Mayor Alan Arakawa today announced that the County of Maui has received several reports of a scam operating in the county involving real property tax and the circuit breaker that should be brought to the attention of our community.

The scam involves a questionable "consultant" contacting home owners in Maui County and offering them reductions in their real property taxes through the home owners' exemption and the circuit breaker for a \$1,500 fee.

"We always hear of scams like this," said Mayor Arakawa, "but recently the Department of Finance has noted an increase in the number of homeowners reporting instances of individuals misrepresenting themselves as County employees, as businesses working with the County to get discounted fees or to having an 'inside track' to discounted real property taxes.

"All information about the home owners' exemption and how it works, as well as how to qualify for the real property tax 'circuit breaker' is available absolutely free of charge from the County of Maui Department of Finance, Real Property Tax Division, Collections Section at 270-7697," Arakawa said.

In addition, Department of Finance Director Kalbert Young has announced that the 2005 round of free circuit breaker informational sessions will begin next month: October 27, Mitchell Pauole Center, Molokai; November 3, Lahaina Civic Center; November 9, Tavares Community Center, Pukalani; November 10, Velma McWayne Santos Community Center, Wailuku; November 16, Kihei Community Center; November 22, Kaunoa Senior Center; December 7, Lanai Senior Center; and, December 16, Helene Hall in Hana. All sessions will begin at 9:30 a.m. and the public is invited.

More details about the circuit breaker sessions will be available closer to the dates, but the public is invited to call the Department of Finance, Real Property Tax Division, Collections Section at 270-7697 at any time and with any question free of charge.

## LawSuit Filed to Halt New Orleans' Violations of 2nd Am. by Gun Seizure

U.S. District Judge Jay Zaney issued a temporary restraining order to block authorities from confiscating law-abiding citizens' firearms in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. The lawsuit was brought by the Second Amendment Foundation and the National Rifle Association against New Orleans Mayor Ray Nagin and Police Chief Edwin Compass III who had authorized gun confiscations from everyone in the hurricane disaster area. Judge Zaney also ordered those in power to return guns seized by them or their agents to anyone "...who lawfully possessed them, upon presentation of identification and execution of a receipt therefore."

"This is a great victory, not just for the NRA and SAF, but primarily for law-abiding gun owners everywhere," said SAF founder Alan M. Gottlieb. "We are proud to have joined forces with the NRA to put an end to what has amounted to a warrantless gun grab by authorities in New Orleans and surrounding jurisdictions."

The controversy erupted when the New Orleans superintendent of police directed that no civilians in New Orleans will be allowed to have guns and that "only law enforcement are allowed to have weapons." The New Orleans' deputy police chief, said "No one will be able to be armed. We are going to take all the weapons."

A camera crew from KTVU filmed one incident in which visiting California Highway Patrol officers tackled an elderly woman identified as Patricia Konie, to seize her pistol and forcibly remove her from her home. An ABC news crew accompanying an Oklahoma National Guard unit filmed another incident in which homeowners were handcuffed and disarmed, then released but without their firearms.

However, Blackwater, an international contractor that provides mercenaries in Afghanistan, Iraq, has admitted that it sent at least 150 personnel to New Orleans and others to Alabama and Mississippi to protect wealthy private properties, and their personnel were seen carrying military-style shotguns that had been modified for urban warfare and fully automatic rifles, but police made no attempt to disarm them.

Gottlieb said not only did residents of New Orleans lose "virtually everything" in Hurricane Katrina, they were also essentially "stripped" of their right to self-defense. In cases reported to SAF, police refused to give citizens receipts for their seized firearms. Earlier, SAF insisted that police account for all seized firearms, disclose their whereabouts, and explain how they will be returned to their rightful owners.

Authorities did not respond.

"SAF and NRA had no alternative but to take action," said Gottlieb. Otherwise, the gun seizures "would have set a dangerous precedent that would have encouraged authorities in other jurisdictions to believe they also could suspend the civil rights of citizens in the event of some other emergency."


Gottlieb challenged New Orleans authorities to explain how they will promptly "return all of those firearms to their rightful owners." He said the ruling "affirms is that even in the face of great natural disasters, governments cannot arbitrarily deprive citizens of their rights."

NRA-ILA Executive Director Chris W. Cox. "This is an important victory. But the battle is not over. The NRA will remedy state emergency statutes in all 50 states, if needed, to ensure that this injustice does not happen again."

NRA also pledges that it will continue its work to ensure that every single firearm arbitrarily and unlawfully seized under this directive is returned to its rightful law-abiding owner. "We need to hear from members who have been a victim of this gun confiscation initiative."

## Shameful policy caused many pets' deaths after Hurricane Katrina

Weeks after Hurricane Katrina, many of us have seen distressing coverage of animals discarded on rooftops or at stations where people boarded buses for Red Cross shelters. We have read stories of small dogs grabbed by police officers from the arms of old people and sobbing young children.

Some stories are almost unbelievable in a civilized nation. One man survived for five days in a tree with his 16-year-old dachshund-Chihuahua. His rescuers would not let him carry the dog onto a boat. He killed his beloved companion rather than leave her to starve in the tree.

In the midst of such tales we also read the quote from Michael Brown as he left his post as director of the Federal Emergency Management Agency. It began with, "I am going to go home and walk my dog." His policies stole that last sweet comfort from those who had nothing else left.

The refusal to acknowledge the bond people have with their animals hampered the evacuation, since some people refused to leave. It also increased, exponentially, people's loss. Further, the official animal ban illuminated the class issue: Whereas Marriott hotels welcomed pets as part of the family, Red Cross shelters forced people to abandon that part of the family or to ride out the storm. Many people died as a result. Others remained for weeks in the disease-infested area.

Media stories have focused on the plight of the animals and of people frantic over the fate of their pets. Only a few have been insensitive to the issue. Perhaps most confused was a column in Slate Magazine that contended that although it was sad the dogs were starving, "their owners should have evacuated them - and themselves - before the storm hit, when pets could be accommodated more easily." As if the destitute folks without gas or even cars, who didn't head for the nearest pet-friendly hotel before the storm, had only themselves to blame.

If dog bites are a concern, then surely cheap disposable muzzles should be part of FEMA and Red Cross deployment equipment. And, yes, some people are allergic to animals, particularly cats, which is why people traveling with cats might have to be transported separately. It would also be fair to recommend that cats be placed in adjoining shelters - anywhere, as long as their families knew they were safe.

Let's compare our nation's treatment of animals to that of other countries: In Cuba last September, more than 1.5 million people were evacuated to higher ground before a storm. About 20,000 houses were destroyed, and nobody died. The people were told to take their animals, and veterinarians were provided. Far from causing chaos, the evacuation of animals prevented it. The Cuban government did not have to deal with people refusing to leave their animals and did not have to force them to leave them.

Gandhi said, "The greatness of a nation can be judged by the way its animals are treated." How embarrassing it must be for our government to see that in emergencies the United States lags behind Cuba, whose treatment of animals saved the animals' lives and those of the people who care for them. In the wake of Katrina, the shameful no-pet policies of American relief agencies killed some people, mostly poor. It devastated many more, who will rebuild their homes but will never get over the awful choice a great nation should not have forced them to make.

## Honey Sales Prohibited on Kauai?

I was a speaker at an apiculture training session in Lihue yesterday for a very valuable program funded by the Pacific Gateway Center. I was astonished to learn that honey is prohibited from being sold at the Farmers' Markets sponsored by the County of Kauai because it is considered to be "processed". This basis for this policy is incorrect and needlessly discriminates against a crucial part of the agricultural community. Our pure, raw, unheated Hawaiian honeys are no more processed than are potatoes or cabbages that are harvested, washed, trimmed and put into boxes to be transported to market. Furthermore, under Act 63, signed into law by Governor Lingle on May 19, 2005, any beekeepers producing up to 50 gallons of honey can sell their properly labeled products directly to the public without any further regulation by the State. This legislation was written and supported by the HBA, the BIBA, the Department of Agriculture, the Hawaii Farm Bureau and many others so that beekeepers could sell their high quality products at venues such as Farmers' Markets! This policy is misguided and harmful in that it needlessly discourages both small scale and commercial producers of nature's purest product from even getting involved in value added honey production... and it is counterproductive to the stated aims of our Governor and the Department of Agriculture to promote and protect sustainable and diversified agriculture and import replacement in Hawaii. Please ask the County Council to take immediate action to rescind this policy and encourage the sale of your fine local honeys at all Farmers' Markets... and announce this policy change in local media and contact all interested parties. ## Enforce the Bill of Rights !

President John Adams, addressing the military on October 11, 1798, challenged the soldiers to be virtuous. "Avarice, ambition, revenge, would break the strongest cords of our Constitution...Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people," he said.

Like many of our founding fathers who were firmly grounded in the principles of the Holy Bible, Adams was propounding the eternal truths he had learned from Scripture. His observations were profound. One only need do a review of current events and it becomes obvious that Adams' concern was well founded. We as a Nation have lost our way; we have cast off the moorings of "morality and religion" and are adrift on an aimless sea journey where the only principle recognized is some vague, collective sense of right and wrong that changes with each judicial pontification: Lies are truth, war is Peace, ignorance is bliss as in 1984.

Before taking office, every member of Congress, every state legislator, every executive and judicial officer is required to "be bound by Oath or Affirmation to support this Constitution". But do we as citizens, supposedly their boss, hold them to account for their oath?

The morality and religion, which Adams held essential for our Constitution to work, has clearly departed. Books have been written pointing at one thing or another

as the cause of the death of morality and religion and I suppose most have an element of truth. This has caused some to pull out of the political battlefield and devote themselves wholly to the battle to restore our Republic and our Constitutional limits on government.

We need a plan of attack on the myriad of lawbreakers posing as lawmakers, government officials, judges - a way to hold them accountable to the Oath they've taken.

Politicians and bureaucrats wanting to prove themselves tough on crime are fond of designing certain "double penalty" provisions for crimes that are especially politically incorrect though usually victimless, that is, those crimes that are more annoying to the sensitivities of the "Newspeakers" than say, simple mayhem. The strong arm of government is brought to bear with special severity on those who commit certain socially unacceptable crimes such as medical marijuana use, or anti-war Bush.

Non-violent criminals are put away for life, or often shot dead. Using a gun in the commission of a crime demands a mandatory minimum five year jail term. [ It is just so much more socially acceptable to use a lead pipe to assault your victim than to use a gun!] And speaking of the horrors of guns, zero tolerance fascism means kids pointing with their fingers and saying "bang!" must be suspended from school! Your fascist government !

Sex offenders must wear a scarlet letter of registration and community notification wherever they live. Dads who neglect to pay child support forfeit their "privilege" of being able to drive a car, buy a hunting license or participate in a whole host of other gratuity bits of candy that big Daddy government passes out to those who behave

themselves, don't criticize government.

Our country has lost its way! We need the enactment of laws that would view Oath breaking by public officials as the heinous crime that it is!

When a legislator or a member of the executive branch or a judge promises, implicitly or otherwise, that in exchange for his vote they will see to it that some legislation he favors will get passed or that funds will be released for that project in his district, he should be tried for bribery. Is it any less bribery because they are promising unconstitutional federal handouts instead of slipping envelopes of cash under the desk?

I think not. There is NO difference! Its a crime!

We ought to start calling bribery, fraud and corruption in high places that such crime includes felony Violation of Oath to uphold and defend the Constitution for the United States of America, and let it be known that third world political lawlessness will not be tolerated here. Call on U.S. Attorneys everywhere to vigorously prosecute these crimes of official corruption. Demand that those who engage in them not only be impeached and removed from office but that they be denied forever any benefits that would otherwise accrue from their government service.
